In 1624, Edward Latymer, a city merchant, bequeathed property to trustees to, "clothe and educate eight poore boies of Edmonton".

This endowment established the school and, combined with those of subsequent benefactors, now comprises The Latymer Foundation, a registered charity. This supports the school in many ways, funding projects to enhance life at Latymer.

The school greatly values the degree of independence bestowed by its founders and its voluntary aided status, which have allowed it to develop traditions of excellence while staying anchored in the maintained sector of education.

We have five orchestras, a concert band, choirs and many other vocal and instrumental ensembles. The school hosts many concerts and there is an annual junior and senior musical production. The school has many students who go on to take up music places at the most prestigious universities or conservatoires each year.

Classes and Year Groups

There are approximately 186 pupils in each year group led and supported by a Head and Assistant Head of Learning, who stay with the pupils throughout Years 7-11. We have six form groups in each year and each form is assigned to one of our Houses.

The House System

Our House system is embedded in the tradition of the school and is a great strength. There are six Houses - Ashworth, Dolbé, Keats, Lamb, Latymer and Wyatt and all pupils are linked to one through their form group. The Houses operate competitively in a wide range of activities: this allows all students to get involved in something they enjoy. Equally important, the Houses run community service events and charity fundraising.

School Trips and Exchanges

Latymer has links with schools in France, Germany and Russia and exchange visits take place annually. Collaborative exchanges with the Mwambisi School in Tanzania are also part of school life. Many other trips take place: in recent years our geographers have been to Iceland, classicists to Italy, artists to New York, and junior boy and girl footballers to Holland, Italy and Cyprus. Each summer our senior musicians tour in Europe, and every other year a sports tour travels to Barbados and media students visit Hollywood. In addition there are many day visits associated with the curriculum for all pupils, including theatres, museums, places of worship and historical sites.





Clubs and Societies

"To provide a wide range of opporunities for all pupils" is one of our principal aims and we are fortunate to have a significant number of clubs and societies. Examples are the Literary Society, Sociology Society, Medical Society, Chess Club and Amnesty International — believed to be the largest and most active school group in the country.

Sport

We are rightly proud of the sporting tradition at Latymer School; there is an extensive sports programme for those interested in both recreational and competitive sport. Inter-school fixtures are played in many sports with our rugby, football, netball and cross country particularly strong. Our facilities are excellent and students benefit from a large, modern sports hall, gym, extensive fields and state of the art fitness centre which is well used by staff and students outside of lesson time.

YSGOL Latymer Outdoor Pursuits Centre

Our outdoor pursuits centre, a former primary school in Cwm Penmachno, lies in the stunning Snowdonia National Park. The accommodation is well-equipped holding up to 40 pupils and staff. All pupils have the opportunity to spend a week at the centre in year 7 and again in year 9, taking part in a variety of outdoor activities. These include hill walking, orienteering, mountain biking, climbing, abseiling, canoeing and rafting. As well as being hugely enjoyable the trips also help develop teamwork skills and friendships.
