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

Introduction

The Stamford Endowed Schools are offering a fantastic opportunity for a Sports Graduate Assistant to join us for a one year programme at Stamford Junior School beginning September 2020.

We would like to hear from Sports Science Graduates who are passionate about their subject, who can also offer leadership in some element of the schools sporting extracurricular programme, and who are interested in gaining experience in teaching and coaching. The Stamford Endowed Schools will endeavour to support Graduates in their professional development in sports provided within the schools. The Sports Graduate Assistant will become a member of the academic staff, playing a full role in our thriving independent day and boarding schools.

At the end of the one-year post we would normally expect the Sports Graduate Assistant to further their careers in other schools. However, should a position arise within the Stamford schools then we would be happy to consider an application.





During the day you will be actively teaching & coaching in the PE & Sports Programme, but on a reduced timetable. You will be managed by the Head of Sport and be given support and guidance through regular meetings.

After school you will take part in the full extracurricular programme, ideally offering a specialism that can be supported by in-house training. You will be attached to one of our seven boarding houses, where you will contribute to the care and supervision of boarders, liaising closely with other boarding staff concerning the progress and welfare of pupils. You will carry out at least two evening duties a week (or equivalent), playing a full and active role in the activities programme of the house.

CORE PURPOSE

To contribute to the Physical Education and Sports programme of the School. Be actively involved in the extra-curricular life of the school offering a specialist activity to enhance pupil's learning outside of timetabled learning activities. Support the boarding experience by undertaking regular boarding duties.

- Undertake allocated teaching & coaching duties on a partial timetable with support and guidance.
- Supervising boarders and general house activities.
- Undertake weekend duties including accompanying trips and activities.
- Assist with coaching activities, directing, supervising and participating in team leadership.
