The Preparatory School

The Role

- To support, implement and deliver an appropriately broad, balanced, relevant and differentiated sports curriculum, including swimming for pupils (mainly girls);
- To participate proactively in the department's planning and development of sports teaching;
- Willingness to referee and umpire matches, after School and Saturday matches;
- Maintenance of stock and equipment/ facilities of sports department;
- Participation in personal and whole school Continued Professional Development (CPD) programmes, with a willingness to keep up to date with all training and qualifications, including first aid;
- A defined commitment to the co-curricular aspects of life at the School;
- Such other duties as would normally be expected from a preparatory school teaching assistant;
- As a member of the Prep School staff, be engaged in the educational life of the School.



Duties and Responsibilities

The successful candidate will:

- Have some formal certified training in sports education and experience with coaching primary aged children, coaching qualifications are beneficial;
- Be a role model for pupils, inspiring them to be actively interested in all sports;
- Actively promote school policies and procedures;
- Be passionate about teaching and keeping up with the latest advances in the world of primary education matters;
- Have good administrative and ICT skills;
- Be physically fit;
- Have good personal skills to coordinate bookings and events within the department ;
- Comply with the school's Health & Safety policy and undertake risk assessments as appropriate;
- Have an ability to take on school duties for clubs, activity, to take part in supporting groups;
- Collaborate with staff to support and develop the department and facilities;
- Be willing and able to co-operate and communicate effectively with other colleagues and departments as the daily life of such a school would require;
- Communicate effectively with the parents of pupils as appropriate;
- Clean driving licence.
- Be available to work on Wednesdays and Thursdays during term time.
