We have an exciting opportunity for an enthusiastic Unqualified PE Teacher to join our team to teach across Primary and Secondary supporting children who have speech and language and communication difficulties.

The role involves teaching and delivering a modified PE curriculum to pupils in Primary and Secondary working from a modified National Curriculum, as well as covering some lessons in other subjects. The teacher will be expected to teach within a maximum class size of 12 pupils, working alongside an experienced team of LSAs, Occupational Therapists and Speech and Language Therapists. You will be expected to support in the organising and delivering of annual trips away and also to teach some other subjects.
