Purpose and objectives of role	The Royal Hospital School is a boarding school with a commitment to providing a broad range of activities and opportunities to its pupils. As such, there is an expectation that there will be a commitment to boarding and contributing to the wider curriculum. Further details and specific tasks such as duties in House, are covered in the Royal Hospital School's Staff Handbook.
Characteristics of a Graduate Sports Assistant	Games teaching takes place on Monday and Tuesday mornings and Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday afternoons. The morning session starts at 11.10 and ends at 13.00. Afternoon games start at 14.15 and end at 16.00.
	Graduates will be expected to take a full and active role in the schools' extracurricular programme.
	Matches take place on Saturday afternoons and you will be required to umpire, referee or escort matches 'home' and 'away'.
	Opportunities exist for coaching in major team games, particularly in rugby, netball, hockey, cricket and tennis. This will entail training, selecting the team, keeping records each week.
	Graduates also help with P.E. lessons and are based in the PE department. This role is to contribute to team teaching the PE programme of study. PE is taught in year group forms in years 7 to 11 – 55 minute periods.
	Requests to obtain coaching qualifications will be carefully considered though it is hoped you will already be qualified in various areas of our sporting programme.
	Opportunities will exist for management, teaching and coaching, working closely with PE professionals, other subject areas and other members of the teaching staff.
	Additional Duties (not definitive)
	The school organises many trips and excursions which, where possible you will be encouraged to become involved.
	 You will be expected to attend school assembly and Chapel services during the week and on special occasions such as the annual Carol service at Christmas.

	There are a few Sunday sports events which you will be encouraged to support and all staff contribute to the annual Sports Day which takes place on a Sunday
