About the School

Alpha Preparatory School was founded in 1895 and is a co-educational school for pupils aged 3-11, situated in central Harrow. We are a small, friendly school of approximately 155 pupils, including our on-site nursery, Alphabets. Our latest ISI inspection (November 2016) rated both the quality of our pupils' academic achievements and personal development as excellent.

Philosophy

Alpha has a long and successful tradition of encouraging children to aspire to high academic and personal standards. We are a small, friendly school with strong family values and this creates a supportive environment in which children feel valued and can learn with confidence.

We are proud of our academic results; however, we believe that good education is about so much more than passing exams. The personal skills and attitudes that are developed in these precious years will greatly influence children's future happiness and success. We want our children to enjoy their school experience, to develop a love of learning and an interest in the world around them. We want to support their growth as compassionate, well-adjusted people who can interact positively with others and have a firm sense of right and wrong. Vision

Aims

Broadly, our aims are as follows:

- To encourage in our children a sense of responsibility to each other and respect for each other's cultures and beliefs.
- To help our children develop a pride in their work, their appearance and their environment.
- To teach children the value of good manners and the need to accept responsibility for their actions.
- To adhere to the school's Christian tradition, but at the same time develop an understanding and respect for the beliefs of others.
