

Modern Foreign Languages Department

Introduction

The Modern Foreign Languages department comprises an experienced and enthusiastic team of eight teachers who pride themselves on the high level of support they offer to their pupils, as well as to each other. We have high expectations of all students and create a working climate in our classrooms where fulfilling potential is the norm. At the centre of our work is a focus on high quality, effective teaching and learning. We are committed to providing and encouraging high levels of challenge, feedback, pupil independence and engagement in all our lessons. The school was judged to be an "Outstanding" school following the last Ofsted inspection in October 2013.

Curriculum

Pupils study French upon entry to The Weald in Year 7. Most pupils also study either German or Spanish as a second foreign language. Most students at Key Stage 4 continue learning a language and this leads to a full GCSE (AQA) qualification. We have recently made the transition to a 3 year KS4. In the Sixth Form, French, German and Spanish are all offered as Advanced level courses (AQA). All three languages are well established in our Key Stage 5 curriculum.

Staffing and Accommodation and Extra-Curricular

The department consists of eight teachers and regular student teacher placements. All staff teach across the age & ability range. The facilities are very good with almost all lessons timetabled in the Languages suite (which consists of seven rooms and a central faculty workroom) or in an ICT room. Each teaching room is equipped with its own interactive whiteboard, computer and audio facilities. The department has access to a 30 station computer room on the languages corridor and this is regularly used by all languages staff. The department prides itself on the opportunities available to students to enhance their languages skills. There are residential trips for students to France, Germany and Spain.
