The new Head of Business Studies, ICT and Vocational Learning will look to:

- Manage the Business Studies, ICT, Child Development and H+SC departments
- Lead on the coordination of developing approaches to teaching vocational subjects across the school

Standard teaching contact times are:

- 42 periods per fortnight (84% class contact time) full time teacher
- 40 periods per fortnight (80% class contact time) NQT
- 40 periods per fortnight (80% class contact time) Head of Subject

• 36 periods per fortnight (72% class contact time) – Head of Faculty (including this role) These contact times compare extremely favourably with many schools.
