Stanchester Academy has an absolute commitment to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children. #### Information about the school

Stanchester is currently a small rural secondary school with eight feeder primary schools situated in villages and small market towns across a nine mile radius. In July 2019 the Governing Body made the decision to apply to join Bridgwater and Taunton College Trust, which was approved by the Trust and subsequently by the Regional Schools commissioner in September. The Academy officially joined the Trust on December 1st.

The decision to join the Bridgwater and Taunton College Trust has enabled senior leaders to plan for a secure and stable future with additional capacity to support continual improvement. The Academy is growing, with numbers on roll currently standing at 680. The roll increased significantly in September 2019 when the Academy returned to a six form entry admission policy (current numbers on roll and PAN can be seen on the Academy website).

The Academy has two ambitions for its students:

- Providing the optimal intellectual experience, in which students master a breadth of academic and vocational disciplines in order that they may thrive academically, personally and professionally.
- Equipping students with the life skills that will ensure success in life as outstanding citizens in their local, national and global community.

The staff at Stanchester are absolutely committed to these ambitions and recognise the value of providing a curriculum, in and beyond the classroom that engages, motivates, inspires and challenges young people. Throughout the curriculum there is a relentless focus on student's personal growth through a character development framework that has been in place for three years – the Stanchester 6Cs. The whole curriculum in year 7 is centred around this framework with a commitment to personal development lessons where students reflect on their own growth and identify where they need to improve in order to impact on their overall approach to life and learning.

In 2015 the Edge Academy was founded. The Edge Academy is a prestigious enrichment programme for the highest achieving students. The aim, to provide the top 20% of students with experiences and opportunities which will raise their academic aspirations and ultimately close the gap between those students from the independent sector and those in the state sector successfully applying for places in Russell group universities. The first cohort to receive a full programme through the Edge Academy achieved a Progress 8 score of +0.28 in 2019.

The Academy operates a three year key stage 3 to ensure students are exposed to as broad a curriculum as possible before narrowing their choices to three subjects as well as the core in key stage 4. All students learn two languages in year 7 – French and Spanish, making a choice of which one to continue in year 8. The provision for PE was increased in key stage 3 four years ago to return it to three hours a fortnight. In 2017 we introduced a new themed year 7 curriculum to support students with transition. In the themed curriculum the humanities subjects are grouped together as 'Enquire' and the creative and performing arts under 'Create', all teachers work under a theme each term which culminates in a show case event for parents.

Academic attainment has fluctuated over the last five years, as is often the case with small cohorts (year 11 2018 of 95 students). Key areas for improvement are English, high prior attainers in maths, science and computing. A review of the curriculum offer has recently been completed, resulting in a revised offer and an increase in the number of vocational subjects offered at key stage 4. The successful candidate to this post will line manage the Assistant Headteacher responsible for curriculum, as well as line managing outcomes and teaching and learning.
