Key Purpose

To facilitate the delivery of AAT Accountancy, IAB Payroll and LIBF Finance accredited courses at the Centre for Lifelong Learning.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

In addition to the duties laid down by City and Islington College conditions of service, the post holder will:

- Coordinate, teach and assess a range of AAT qualifications (Accounting, Computerised Accounts, Payroll and Bookkeeping) and LIBF qualifications (Lessons in Financial Education) & (Certificate/Diploma in Financial Studies)
- 2. Support students effectively in all aspects of their learning as a subject teacher and course tutor
- 3. Produce activities and mark quality assessments of student's work
- 4. Produce high quality course documentation and maintain student records, including individual assessment records
- 5. React positively to the changing curriculum and help to manage, develop and coordinate new and existing courses
- 6. Complete all administration work relevant to teaching on College course





Expectations of the Post Holder

You will be expected to mark students' work carefully and thoroughly, giving advice on how it could be improved, and also correcting spelling, grammar and vocabulary when necessary.

Newly appointed staff without a Level 2 English and Maths qualification will be supported with in-service training to develop their professional skills to enable them to confidently develop the English and Maths skills of their students.
