The school has a maximum capacity of 230 students and maximum class sizes of 24 for students In Years 7-11 and 14 for Sixth Form lessons.

At North Bridge House Senior Canonbury, we are dedicated to providing our students with an outstanding education and to developing happy, confident young adults with the skills to become future leaders. Thanks to our small class sizes and flexible approach to timetabling, we are able to tailor our teaching and support to meet the needs of every child.

Our team of specialist and dedicated teachers contains a blend of state, independent and international school experience, and provides the inspiration our pupils need to achieve their academic goals. We are immensely proud of our Value Added performance and attainment at A-Level, our recent 2020 results are 40% A* and 68% A*-A - whilst 66% of our GCSE entries In 2020 were graded at 7 or above. The focus on academic excellence is complemented by first class pastoral care and attention to the learning needs of every child.

With experts continuing to shed ever-more light on teenage learning patterns and the stages of their brain development, we believe that by effectively harnessing this research we can maximise the potential of each individual. Our work with the wider Cognita family of schools has led us to introduce a Global Be Well Day focusing on students personal wellbeing. We are also currently working with the University College London on how to better understand students' metacognitive skills and implementing effective teaching and learning strategies in the classroom.

To broaden our pupils' interests and help them develop new and transferable skills, we offer a diverse enrichment programme - often in conjunction with our sister schools. Every two years, students from both our site and our Hampstead Senior school site visit Malawi to undertake charity work, whilst during Easter 2018 a number of our students will visit China to supplement their Mandarin lessons which are firmly embedded within our timetable.



The role of Graduate Assistant

We are a non-academically selective school and pride ourselves in empowering our teachers to provide in class differentiation. This new role will involve monitoring the progress of individual students as well as delivering small group intervention classes.

Key Responsibilities

- Contribute to the creation of development plans, policies, curriculum documents, risk assessments etc. in liaison with the SENCO and the Senior Leadership Team.
- Record and report upon the development, progress and attainment of SEN pupils and share this information with pupils, parents/ guardians and colleagues.
