Primary Objective:

To lead the design, implementation and evaluation of educational programs to achieve optimal outcomes for students diagnosed on the Autism Spectrum. Provide educational leadership and advice on appropriate teaching approaches, behaviour management and classroom strategies to facilitate the effective and successful inclusion of the students with on the Autism Spectrum in their mainstream schools.

Context Statement:

The Mimik-ga Centre provides early intervention services for students aged from birth to 12 years focusing on young children who have special needs. The center delivers two Autism Spectrum Disorder Classes, a Families as First Teachers (FAFT) program, has a Positive Learning Centre.

The ASD program caters for students with a diagnosed ASD who are experiencing moderate to severe barriers to learning in a mainstream classroom setting. The Senior Teacher and the Special Education Support Officer work collaboratively to enable students to maximise their learning within school, home and community settings

Key Duties and Responsibilities:

- Provide leadership to teachers and other staff in the development and implementation of effective educational programs for students on the Autism Spectrum and high support needs, including positive behaviour strategies and transition support from the CommAut Program to home schools.
- 2. Collaborate within a multi-agency framework, including home schools, host schools, outside agencies and families to develop, implement and maintain inclusive practices to ensure required adjustments are implemented.
- 3. Lead the implementation of processes that support students with special needs including profiling, referral processes, educational adjustment plans, positive behaviour support plans, assessment and data collection and analysis.
- 4. Liaise and consult with school leadership and student support team and provide advice in relation to student's individual needs and staff capacity building needs

Selection Criteria

Essential:

- Registration with the Northern Territory Teacher Registration Board, current Working with Children Clearance Notice (Ochre Card).
- 2. Demonstrated ability to lead the delivery of programs for students on the Autism Spectrum and experience sharing these skills and practices with others.
- 3. Demonstrated high level interpersonal, negotiation and communication skills to work effectively with families, students, allied health professionals, staff and other agency and community members.
- 4. Demonstrated knowledge, skills and ability to relate effectively to primary aged students on the Autism Spectrum, including students who may display challenging behaviours.
- Effective interpersonal skills and the demonstrated ability to successfully teach in a team teaching situation. High levels of
 emotional intelligence and demonstrated ability to show empathy, patience and work effectively in a dynamic and challenging
 environment.
- 6. Proven ability to lead the delivery of effective professional development to the broader community and meet reporting and data collection requirements.

Desirable

- Sound knowledge of current research, legislations, policies and practices in relation to leadership and the education of students with special educational needs.
