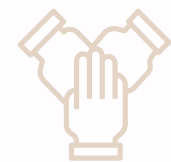

What makes a **Malvern Education Special?**



Appreciating each pupil's uniqueness

An approach to learning that values experience and creativity, small class sizes, dedicated tutor time and a genuine concern for the individual are key features of a Malvern education. Pupils get exposed to a high degree of personal attention by the teaching staff, and teachers can differentiate according to individual aptitude, ability and interest.



The aim of Malvern College Hong Kong is to further not only pupils' academic, but also their social, emotional and physical development. To this effect, the school emphasises a balanced learning experience across the core subject groups, thus fostering a well-rounded education including language, mathematics, science, humanities, design, arts and physical education.

To stretch and nurture the multi-faceted potential of high ability pupils, the school provides appropriate learning opportunities and challenges, overseen by the school's Gifted & Talented Co-ordinator.

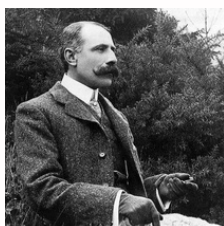
Pastoral care and wellbeing

The school's strong pastoral care seeks to embed the ethos of a boarding school into a day-school setting where we strive to develop a tight-knit community of pupils and teachers. We provide counselling as well as career and university guidance for senior year groups. The school's pastoral life focuses around an active house system: all pupils and teachers are assigned to one of Malvern's six houses, working together and competing against each other at different inter-house sporting and academic events throughout the year.

Caring for pupils' wellbeing

Malvern College Hong Kong believes that pupils' wellbeing and happiness must be a joint effort between school and parents, and that the end goal can only be achieved if both parties work together.

Malvern College Hong Kong embeds a focus on wellbeing across the school through the curriculum and dedicated tutor time. Its entire academic team is carefully and thoroughly trained to assess and monitor pupils' wellbeing, identify problems early on, and provide appropriate support.



Forest-Beach School

We believe that access to an outdoor environment is as important to a child's wellbeing and developmental growth as a conventional classroom setting. Malvern College Hong Kong is one of the first schools in Hong Kong to operate a Forest-Beach School programme, managed by certified Forest School leaders. The programme is built on a philosophy of child-led learning, with a focus on all five senses. It runs in all safe weather conditions.

Nature, the outdoors, and open spaces become the children's temporary classroom, with educational sessions designed around a theme. Teamwork, intra- and inter-personal skills are developed through games and group activities, whilst self-esteem, individual practical and intellectual skills are enhanced through activities like shelter building, tool handling or lighting fires (under the supervision of the Forest School educator).

Digital Citizenship

Malvern College Hong Kong fully embraces technology to support and enhance learning. We place great emphasis on educating young people to become responsible and informed users of digital technology. Digital Intelligence (DQ) is an embedded part of the school's education and topics including digital identity, online safety and security as well as digital creativity and entrepreneurship are covered as an integral part of the curriculum.

We encourage pupils to consider how they communicate and connect with the world via digital devices, equipping them with a comprehensive set of technical, cognitive and socio-emotional competencies.



Global Perspective

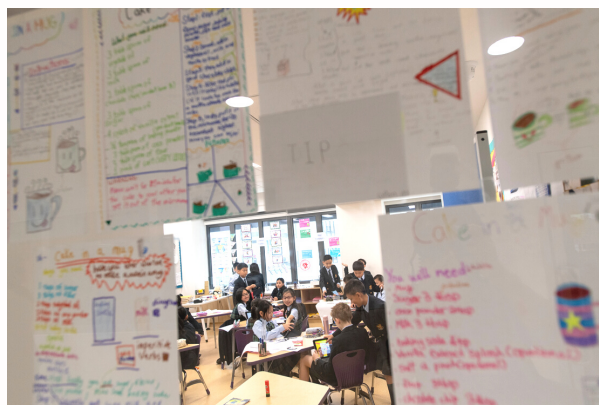

Our Curriculum

Malvern College Hong Kong is an IB World School and offers the Primary Years Programme (PYP), the Middle Years Programme (MYP) and is a candidate school for the IB Diploma Programme.* Malvern College Hong Kong follows the example of Malvern College UK by implementing a globally accepted and well-established curriculum so pupils can continue their studies at a wide variety of universities around the world. We believe an internationally accepted programme not only meets the needs of our culturally diverse pupil body, it also provides ample opportunity to recognise education as both global in content and outlook, emphasising the interconnectedness of knowledge.

OUR CURRICULUM IS:

- recognised and admired by top universities around the world, thus opening many doors for our graduates as they pursue higher education;
- inquiry-based where children are able to explore ideas and concepts and consequently develop a body of knowledge at their own pace;
- rigorous and challenging, applying high standards and expectations to ensure the very best education;
- conceptual, interdisciplinary and holistic, offering opportunities for deeper and broader knowledge in a wide range of subject areas;
- designed to encourage a global perspective and ultimately global citizenship;
- collaborative in nature, involving pupils and teachers in a cyclical process.

The Preparatory Years



Laying a robust academic foundation and introducing a life-long love of learning

Malvern College Hong Kong offers an inquiry-based, transdisciplinary curriculum that encourages pupils to make connections between local and global issues in a real-world context. In prep years, learning takes place by integrating subject areas through a holistic approach that builds both a strong academic foundation and a love of learning.



ACQUIRING KNOWLEDGE

Prep pupils construct and connect their knowledge across different subject groups. They also learn important self-management skills, taking ownership for their learning, and developing their own character while appreciating the diversity of others.

LITERACY AND MATHEMATICS CONTINUUM

Our literacy and mathematics continuum across the prep years is based on British and international standards, inclusively targeting each of our pupils through a personalized approach to their foundational learning.

COLLABORATIVE PROJECT

In the prep years, our pupils take part in a collaborative project where they synthesise their acquired knowledge, conceptual understanding and skills. Prep 6 pupils share their learning journey and conclusions with the Malvern community.

ASSESSMENT

Throughout the prep years, our pupils are assessed and evaluated against international standards using formative and summative means and employing self, peer and teacher assessment tools.

Broadening the curriculum to develop confident, resourceful and independent learners



INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING

Once a year, pupils form subject teams to deliver an interdisciplinary unit designed to synthesise knowledge, concepts and skills into a new learning opportunity. These new holistic understandings may include finding solutions to problems, explaining phenomena, or creating a final performance or product.

PROJECTS

Malvern's Hundred (Year 11) pupils demonstrate their knowledge and develop their skills by completing large-scale group and individual projects which require pupil-led action.

SERVICE AS ACTION

Malvern College Hong Kong harbours a long tradition of making a positive difference to the lives of others and to the environment. Our pupils are encouraged to develop sustainable service projects, both inside and outside the classroom.

ASSESSMENT

With a view to enhancing future learning, assessments for pupils are personalised, meaningful and timely. Learning progress is measured continuously, and pupils take a final assessment at the end of each unit. Pupils and their parents are kept informed of the level of achievement set against specific subject criteria.

LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

MCHK's Leadership Development Programme creates opportunities for all Sixth Form students to explore and discover their own leadership style and develop essential leadership skills.

SIXTH FORM TUTOR PROGRAMME

All Sixth Form students have a personal tutor from amongst the teaching staff, who will meet with them regularly and individually to guide them through the highs and lows of the final two years at school.

CAREERS AND UNIVERSITY GUIDANCE

Malvern's individualised careers and university guidance is tailored to the interests of each student, providing support for applications to universities around the world. Students can make use of in-depth personalised careers profiling to assist with university course choices and future career planning.

ENRICHMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Senior students can take part in expeditions to challenge themselves physically and personally, either through the Hong Kong Award for Young People or through an extended overseas expedition. Service to others is deeply rooted in the Malvern tradition, and all Sixth Form students will participate in challenging and rewarding service activities.

Music

The music department is always a hive of musical activity – whether in the music studios, individual practice rooms, or classrooms. Musical talent is encouraged and supported through both the curricular and co-curricular programmes, with a range of ensembles for experienced and developing musicians including an orchestra, choirs, string ensemble, jazz band and indie band.

Visual Arts

The work of our talented visual artists enlivens the walls of the school. Visual Art is part of the core curriculum from Prep 1 onwards and always a popular co-curricular activity. The school campus features two visual arts studios specifically designed for prep years and senior years where weekly lessons take place.



Drama

Drama is incorporated into units of inquiry in the prep years, leading to dedicated lessons in the foundation years. Senior pupils may elect drama lessons as an option. The co-curricular activities programme features Drama classes for younger pupils and Malvern's Drama Club for seniors.





Pupils who engage in sport not only learn to lead a healthy lifestyle but also develop social and leadership skills. Physical and health education is therefore an integral part of Malvern College Hong Kong's core curriculum, and there is a wealth of sporting activities available within the co-curricular programme.

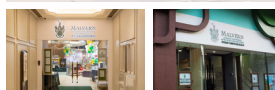

Admissions



Malvern College Hong Kong seeks to build a diverse, multi-cultural pupil population. We take into consideration how our school values align with those of our prospective pupils' families, a meeting with parents and the child is therefore a mandatory part of the admissions process.

Priority for assessment is based on the following criteria:

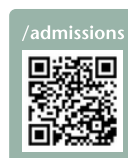
1. Corporate Nomination Right (CNR) nominees;
2. Individual Nomination Right (INR) nominees;
3. Siblings of pupils already attending Malvern College Hong Kong;
4. Malvern College Pre-School Hong Kong pupils (min. one academic year attendance prior to admission);
5. Children of Old Malvernians (alumni);
6. Pupils transferring from another school within the Malvern College Family of Schools (min. two academic years attendance prior to admission);
7. Children who bring diversity in terms of nationality, ethnicity, religion, age and gender.
