Based in the London borough of Havering, our academy specialises in alternative provision and special educational needs, supporting up to 50 pupils for whom traditional teaching methods have not worked. Students join us following permanent exclusion from a mainstream school or due to medical needs, or social, emotional and mental health needs, that prevent them from attending a mainstream setting.

Our mission is to provide our pupils with creative, nurturing and inspiring opportunities which re-engage them in learning. By providing a safe and engaging environment, we endeavour to remove barriers and promote the opportunity for students to excel and reach their full potential. We provide a broad and ambitious curriculum, catered to the needs of each individual, delivering the knowledge and skills that our pupils need to succeed in education and beyond. 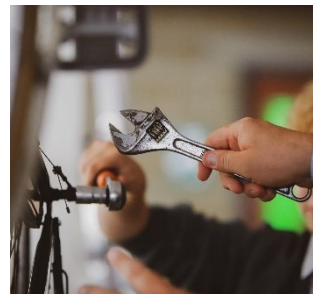
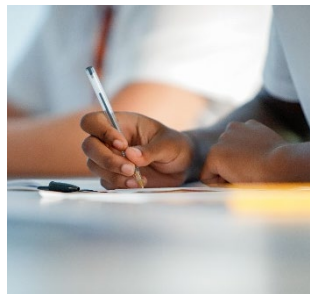
- Giving students real-world experiences.

Job description

We are looking for a suitably qualified individual who will support whole-academy SEND practice, developing partnerships with external agencies and parents/carers in supporting pupils with SEND. Key responsibilities:

- Have a full and detailed knowledge of the SEND code of practice and ensure that the statutory obligations are met in our academy. Champion best practice in SEND provision; demonstrate the highest quality of teaching, learning, and assessment through your practice
- With support from the Senior Leadership Team and SENDCo, take a leading role in developing partnerships with external agencies and parents/carers in supporting pupils with SEND, ensuring that our pupils' views are considered and acted upon appropriately.
- With support from the Senior Leadership Team and SENDCo, support staff in identifying needs and establishing baseline data for pupils on entry to the academy, and ensure this information is recorded and shared with stakeholders
- Support the SENDCo in keeping a system to review, track, and evaluate the progression of EHCPs and SEN support. This will include liaising with all stakeholders, including the local authority and other relevant agencies.
- Using the graduated approach, regularly monitor progress against targets for pupils with SEND; evaluate the effectiveness of teaching and learning by work analysis, and use these evaluations to guide future improvements. This will include making EHCP referrals when appropriate.
- Work with leadership colleagues, including those responsible for literacy and careers, to develop pupil-centred plans and share with all stakeholders.
- Take responsibility for your professional development by actively seeking opportunities for learning and development
- Analyse and interpret relevant academy, local, and national information relating to pupils with SEND and advise the Senior Leadership Team on the level of resources required to maximise achievement.
- To be accountable for promoting and safeguarding pupils' welfare and personal development as part of the academy's approach to SEND support.
- Work with key stakeholders to implement well-considered, efficient, and effective systems and processes for SEND; work with the SENDCos in mainstream schools to ensure effective handover/transition of our pupils.
- To work closely with the academy's Designated Safeguarding Lead and ensure that all due processes are adhered to in regard to child protection and safeguarding procedures.
- Refer children to specialist services and external agencies in discussion with the SENDCo and families.
- Deputise for the SENDCo as appropriate, with regard to meetings and liaising with outside agencies.
- As directed by the Head of Academy/SENDCo, provide advice, strategies, resources, and/or training which enable staff to support children through inclusive approaches with the aim of achieving improved educational outcomes.
- To deliver training and support to OA staff and mainstream colleagues through inreach, outreach, staff meetings, and workshops.
- To lead and deliver some elements of small group/1:1 interventions as directed by the SENDCo.

Note: The duties above are neither exclusive nor exhaustive and the post holder may be required by the head of academy to carry out appropriate duties within the context of the job, skills and grade
