

## Graduate Maths Excellence Specialist

Salary / grade range	£35,000

## Purpose of role:

This is a new opportunity, generously funded by the <u>Maths Excellence Fund</u>, of working for two years in a flexible role with high attaining pupils.

This post comes with the unique opportunity to continue into a graduate pathway in Co-op Academies Trust on the mathematics teacher training programme and then, subject to successful completion, continue as a qualified teacher, with an interest in the Co-op Academies Trust leadership pathways.

The role will involve working with high attaining pupils in a given Co-op Academy, to develop pupils' engagement and involvement in mathematics, so they continue to succeed in mathematics as they progress through school and into sixth form education. Additionally, the purpose of the role is to secure improved mathematics outcomes for high attaining disadvantaged students, and this includes both subject specific support and a broader pastoral dimension.

## Key accountabilities (and specific duties / responsibilities):

## The postholder will:

 regularly tutor a cohort of pupils to improve their mathematics attainment on a one-to-one, small group, or whole class level



- be responsible for a cohort of students and mentor them, tracking their progress and communicating with home and teachers, and school pastoral and safeguarding teams
- maintain records, tracking the academic progress of a cohort of pupils, communicating with school and Co-op Academies Trust leadership
- provide teaching sessions for pupils taking L2 Further Maths and GCSE Statistics qualifications
- plan, design and produce teaching materials and resources
- plan and lead mathematics enrichment workshops and masterclasses
- plan and lead maths revision sessions in half-terms and school holidays (with additional pay), and deliver after-school and pre-exam intervention sessions as and when required to ensure the highest levels of achievement and attainment
- assess, record and report on the development, progress and attainment of the students assigned
- manage the classroom and teaching equipment so as to create a positive learning environment which makes effective use of available resources
- attend meetings, carry out administrative tasks and duties as required
- attend training provided by the school and Co-op Academies Trust, developing a range of effective learning and teaching strategies to raise the achievement of students in preparation for training to teach mathematics
- liaise as required with a range of educational partners, internal and external, to underpin the raising of student attainment
- support the school's home and community liaison work through the appropriate participation in events
- work with other colleagues to lead on new projects to promote mathematics in the community
- function as part of the maths department in which they are placed, working closely with the Head of Subject (or delegated colleague) to achieve the aims of the Maths Excellence Fund and secure strong outcomes for high attaining disadvantaged students
