
Welcome from the Principal

Dame Bradbury's Nursery and Junior School are located in the heart of Saffron Walden, a medieval town with a rich heritage, a famous outdoor market and recently named as one of the best places to live by the Sunday Times. Just 15 miles from Cambridge, there's a thriving arts scene in the town, including a hugely successful cinema, a state of the art concert hall, along with music, literary and maze festivals. Close by is Audley End, one of the finest Jacobean houses in England with beautiful grounds and gardens. Dame Bradbury's itself has a long history. There has been a school on the current site since at least 1317. Now part of the renowned Stephen Perse Foundation, the Junior School and Nursery offer young children the important first years of education, stimulating discovery through exploration, by questioning, initiating ideas and taking pride in every achievement. Junior Schools

There are two Junior Schools in the Stephen Perse Foundation, one in the centre of Cambridge and the other at Dame Bradbury's in Saffron Walden. Your role

Training and support is offered on a regular basis as part of formal and informal CPD and is focused on student learning.

Teaching and Learning

- Teach maths, primarily within Years 3-6, and other subjects as required.
- Be a role model for pupils, inspiring them to be actively interested in maths.
- Be an effective Form Teacher if required.
- Teach consistently high quality lessons with clear differentiation, active learning and embracing the digital toolkit.
- Deliver schemes of work and lessons that meet the requirements of the year group and ability of the pupils, following schemes of work for maths/other subjects as set out by the curriculum leader.
- Contribute to the extensive extra-curricular programme run within the maths department across the school to include maths and coding.
- Provide clear and accurate reports of pupil progress and targets for improvement through the agreed schedule of annual reporting and parents' evenings.
- Liaise with the inclusion specialist and team to discuss individual pupil needs.

Additional Specific responsibilities

- Establish constructive relationships with parents/carers, exchange information, facilitate their support for their child's attendance, access and learning and support home to school and community links.
- Provide advice and guidance to parents as required and appropriate.
- Provide support and encouragement to children.

Being part of a team

- Work with other staff in planning, evaluating and adjusting learning activities as appropriate.
- Work alongside the class form tutor as the teacher of maths.
- Use clear language to communicate information unambiguously to others including children, young people, their families and carers.
- Liaise between senior staff/teaching staff and teaching assistants in the Foundation.
- Attend staff meetings, open days and INSET.
- Participate fully in professional development activities to develop practice further, sharing the learning from these as appropriate.
