Our therapy team consists of Speech and Language Therapists and a Multi Disciplinary Team. We will be expanding to include working with music and with movement and hope to develop OT assistant roles amongst our Teaching Assistants. We have Sensory Integration Therapy currently in place with our OT's and we have support from an NHS OT for more functional life skills. This service will be led by the OT for the first term.

This is an exciting opportunity as this role specifically focuses OT time on students aged between 3 and 19.
