Ewell Castle is a thriving, independent school located in leafy Ewell Village. The school is co-educational from Nursery to Sixth Form and enjoys small classes, averaging approximately fifteen pupils over the whole School. The Head of Rugby will lead on the provision of Rugby teaching, coaching and planning for boys at the senior school, as well as leading and development of the growing girls' programme. The successful candidate will be adept at cascading best practise coaching and skill development to all PE teachers and will take a lead role in the development of Rugby for all at the school.

The Head of Rugby will be able to teach a full range of sports during PE and Games sessions throughout the year and will also be expected to take a full and active role in the pastoral side of the school as a Form Tutor. The ideal candidate will be passionate about sport for all and able to stretch and challenge all pupils and the ability to teach Academic PE at GCSE and or A Level would be an advantage.

Pupils at Ewell Castle play Rugby in the Autumn term, Football in the Spring Term and Cricket and Athletics in the summer term. Girls additionally play Netball in the Autumn and Spring terms.

The PE department run an extensive co curricular programme and the successful candidate will take an active role in the provision and continued development of this programme.

The school has dedicated pitches on site and indoor sports hall. The school runs a very successful <u>Tennis</u> <u>academy</u> and <u>Cricket academy</u> and a thriving sports scholarship programme.

The starting salary for this position will be in accordance with the Ewell Castle Pay Scales which currently track in excess of the maintained sector's pay grades, and will reflect the experience and qualifications of the successful candidate.

In addition to the requirements of the role of Teacher of PE the post holder will be responsible and accountable for all matters in relation to Rugby within the Senior school, working in conjunction with and under the guidance of the Director of Sport.

- Be responsible for planning, coaching and organising all matters related to the teaching of Rugby.
- Lead the coaching of Rugby within timetabled lessons and during co-curricular activities and Saturday fixtures, in line with the departmental plan.
- Prepare coaching and refereeing Insets and clinics as deemed necessary by the Director of Sport, to maintain and develop good practice.
- Develop, organise and maintain a competitive school fixture list for Rugby.
- Ensure the smooth running of Rugby on a daily, weekly and termly basis.
- Maintain a supply of equipment that enables professional coaching of Rugby at the school.
- Take the lead role in organising Rugby tours in conjunction with the Director of Sport.
- Coach, referee, umpire or act as analyst during all weekend fixtures and training sessions for all sports as instructed by the Director of Sport.
- Attend all departmental and school meetings as required by the Director of Sport.
- Make a decision about playing conditions during adverse weather.
- Assist in the planning and running of an effective Sport Scholarship assessment and support the Director of Sport with the Scholarship process.
- Organise video analysis sessions as required to develop pupil knowledge or performance.


- To adhere at all times to Safeguarding and Child Protection regulations, and training.


