It is an exciting time to be joining Our Lady's as our numbers have been growing for the last four years and we are now oversubscribed in a number of year groups and are expecting this pattern to continue. Our academic success consistently places us in the top 10% nationally for pupil progress at KS4. At KS5 our students are again in the top 3 non-selective schools in Lancashire for facilitating subjects and the average Vocational Level 3 grade is Distinction *.

Mathematics Department

We are seeking to appoint an ambitious and enthusiastic teacher to join our successful, forward thinking and supportive mathematics team. The maths department's vision is to work together, as a strong and cohesive team, to provide a consistently high level of teaching and learning in mathematics. We are open-minded and have a positive approach to development and change, with our students at the forefront of this. We aim to enthuse students and improve confidence, promoting the value of mistakes and nurturing a growth mind-set, enabling them to excel. Only the best is good enough for our students and we believe that young people should achieve the best they can in mathematics and are prepared for the everyday challenges they will meet in real life.

The department currently consists of eight teachers and has designated individual classrooms, each well resourced, with projectors and interactive whiteboards. Sharing of good practice and resources is common place.

Students make excellent progress in mathematics throughout their time at Our Lady's. In 2019 GCSE our maths progress 8 score is +0.17 and at A-Level 63% of students achieved grades A*-B. Our students are set and tiered from the beginning of their high school career, but are regularly assessed with the flexibility to move across these boundaries as they advance. Our GCSE students follow the Edexcel maths specification with A level students studying with AQA. At A level, mathematics is a popular choice, with a school-wide focus on future career options and opportunities.
