In September 2017 Sacriston Academy joined the North East Learning Trust, a highly successful multi-academy education Trust which spans the north east of England.

The Trust's vision is simple and shared by all schools who join the family: that 'every child experiences excellence every day'.

The Trust's founding school, The Academy at Shotton Hall, has achieved great success for their children by securing some of the best outcomes in the country. Year on year, the school achieves some of the top GCSE results in County Durham and they have been awarded two consecutive outstanding judgments from Ofsted.

Shotton Hall is also one of just 23 new research schools chosen to pioneer research in education across the north east. In addition, it is a national teaching school, training the next generation of teachers and ensuring the highest standards of teaching are instilled from the outset.
