We focus on the process of good teaching and grades take care of themselves.

Each classroom has two computer screens one that is projected and another screen freed up for your use during the lesson. Most have state of the art 86 inch interactive screens.

Support you with managing student attendance, student work and punctuality.







More time with your classes whilist overall teacing time per week is lower

You will teach each class for 5 1/2 hours a week on 4 different days, maximum of 22 hours teaching timetable per week for a full time teacher.



We focus on the process of good teaching and the grades take care of themselves

A full time teacher will teach a maximum of 4 classes - this means the total number of students you will teach is lower than other insitutions. Enabling you to focus and attend more to your students.



Freed up to focus

You can focus on teaching your subject and you will be freed up from all the other elements of education that can distract you away from this. For example, you will not have a tutor group, there is no break time or lunchtime duties and no report writing.



Opportunity to be an examiner in your subject


We encourage teachers to take up examining roles and facilitate for marking to be completed onsite to help with demands of marking.




