Opened in September 2024, Charterhouse Lagos sets a new standard in education provision in Nigeria and West Africa. With world-class facilities and a focus on excellence, we will develop in our students a passion for learning, for excellence and for leadership.

The school community is self-contained and lies in Ajah on the Lekki Peninsula, south of mainland Lagos. The secure compound offers the best educational facilities in Nigeria. 24-hour security ensures that our students and staff can take advantage of the amazing facilities. We expect the majority of our secondary school students will board at the school.

Facilities include fully connected classrooms, science and STEM labs, music, art, drama and library spaces, an 800-seat professional standard theatre, a 25-metre competition pool, along with a learn-to-swim pool, an NBA standard indoor basketball stadium, outdoor and indoor football pitches, and a beautifully landscaped campus that offers relaxation as well as a connection to nature.

Charterhouse Lagos will offer an international education for students aged 5 to 18 (Years 1 to 13) using the British curriculum and leading to the IGCSE and A-level qualifications. These will allow our students to aspire to the very best universities worldwide.

We hope that you will consider joining us to create an exciting new future in Lekki, Lagos.

Phase 1 of our building programme opened in September 2024 and Phase 2, with the Secondary School and Boarding facilities, opened in September 2025. Phase 3 will follow over the next few years. Years 1 to 9 are already established in our Primary School, and we are adding Years 10 and 12 in Secondary School in September 2026.


- Academic rigour, intellectual curiosity, and the ability to learn independently.

We intend to develop a strong relationship with our mother school in the UK and leverage their experience and heritage as well as share our ideas and practice.





Key Stage 3: Years 7-9

At Charterhouse Lagos, we place significant emphasis on developing the whole student through a broad and enriching secondary education experience. Our curriculum follows a tailored English National Curriculum in Key Stage 3, including Mathematics, English, Science, Humanities, French and Mandarin. This is enhanced with a dynamic blend of STEM subjects, World and African Literature, Physical Education, and Swimming, alongside an innovative Personal, Social, Health, and Education (PSHE) scheme of learning.

In addition, our Charterhouse CAS programme from Years 7-13—encompassing Creativity, Activity, and Service—will foster sustainable partnerships with our local community to encourage our students to explore their passions, engage in meaningful activities, and contribute positively to their communities, thereby preparing them for global citizenship and lifelong learning.

Key Stage 4: Year 10 and Year 11

In KS4 our students will prepare to sit GCSE / IGCSE examinations at the end of Year 11, before transitioning into Sixth Form and Years 12 and 13. Subject options available to study in KS4 will include English Literature, English Language, Maths and Further Maths, Physics, Biology and Chemistry, History and Geography, French and Mandarin. Our students at Key Stage 4 will also engage with our Careers and Higher Education Guidance team in order to tailor their academic paths to their dreams and motivations and look at coherence and progression from Key Stage 4 to Sixth Form and aspirational University destinations.

Sixth Form / Key Stage 5: Year 12 and Year 13

At Charterhouse Lagos, we focus on supporting students in Years 12 and 13 to excel in their A Levels while actively preparing them for prestigious universities in the UK, US, Canada, and Europe. Subject options will include English Literature, Maths and Further Maths, Physics, Biology and Chemistry and French, History and Geography. All Sixth Form students will engage in an enrichment programme of CAS, EPQ and World Perspectives.

Our supportive Careers and Higher Education Guidance team will work closely with students to tailor their academic paths to their aspirations, ensuring a personalised approach through the use of the Gatsby Benchmarks.

We also offer enriching leadership opportunities through our student council, helping students develop both academically and personally, and fostering a vibrant, goal-oriented community.

Extra Curricular Activities (ECAs)

In alignment with our commitment to nurturing well-rounded individuals, Charterhouse Lagos will offer a diverse range of Extra-Curricular Activities (ECAs) for all Secondary students. These are designed to enrich students' educational journeys, and students can engage in activities such as Model United Nations, Debating, Sports, Drama and Theatre, Duke of Edinburgh, and Music.

We believe that active participation in these enriching activities helps build a comprehensive personal profile, helping prepare our students for a successful and positive future.

Boarding

Charterhouse Lagos is a boarding school and so a commitment to boarding education is essential for all our teachers. Boarding is a key part of the Charterhouse DNA inherited from Charterhouse in the UK. Currently, we are currently at 95% boarding vs non-boarding students.

For teachers, this means there is an expectation that you be fully involved in the life of the boarding house. Regular week day evenings and weekend duties are part of the job of every teacher. You will support students academically and pastorally under the guidance of the house parents and resident tutors who take the lead role in all boarding activities.

About Lagos.

Lagos is a port city and the most populous city in Nigeria. The metropolitan area originated on islands, including Lagos Island, that were protected from the Atlantic Ocean by sand spits. The city has expanded onto the mainland west of the lagoon, with Ikeja, the capital of Lagos, and Agege over 25 miles northwest of Lagos Island. Lagos has a population estimated at 21 million in 2016, which makes it the largest city in Africa.

The smallest in area of Nigeria's 36 states, Lagos State is arguably the most economically important state in the country, containing Lagos, the nation's largest urban area. Lagos State is located in the south-western part of the Nigerian Federation. On the North and East it is bounded by Ogun State. In the West, it shares boundaries with the Republic of Benin. Behind its southern borders lies the Atlantic Ocean. 22% of its 3,577 square km are lagoons and creeks.

About the City

Lagos is the former capital city of Nigeria and is also the largest city in all of Africa. Population estimates vary from 15 to 28 million depending on criteria – suffice to say it's a huge and densely populated city that is growing at an unprecedented rate and is buzzing with life both day and night. This noisy city is surrounded by elevated roads, and has many waterways, especially down towards the coast.

The economy of Nigeria is centred in Lagos, particularly as the city benefits from a great deal of oil money and is ideally located as a port on the Gulf of Guinea. The official language of Nigeria is English, though there are several other languages that are spoken throughout Lagos by the inhabitants of the city. Lagos has sprawled from a once regular port town to over 700 square kilometres, and this huge city is famous for its nightlife and music scene.



Lagos has a tropical climate with two rainy seasons. The heaviest rains fall between April and July, whilst the second, lighter rainy season runs through October and November, with a brief drier spell between the two seasons. The temperatures remain similar all year round with a little fluctuation, at an average high temperature of 30°C across the year. Between November and March, the longest dry season is joined by breezes off the Sahara Desert, which are strong and can often be accompanied by sandstorms. These winds can make the weather seem deceptively cool, and it is important to remember that sunscreen is essential all year round.

Transportation in Lagos

Murtala Muhammed International Airport in Lagos hosts flights from all over Africa, Europe and also a few flights from the US. This is the most common way to get into Lagos and is just a 30-minute drive from the city centre, which is easily reachable by taxi or by bus, although we will always transport you in a secure convoy to and from the airport for your safety and security.

Once you are in Lagos, the city may seem very confusing and difficult to navigate to those who do not know their way around. The best advice is to speak to colleagues to advise you how to get places as the city can be confusing, and at first, it may seem like many of the streets are very similar. The school will provide bookable taxis with local knowledge, to assist you and to help you stay safe.

We don't recommend using local buses or taxis (outside those recommended by the school). Road safety standards within vehicles may not be what you expect.

Culture and Leisure

Famed throughout Africa for the music scene, Lagos is also the centre for show business in Nigeria, particularly the movie industry (Nollywood). Sports are important to the inhabitants of Lagos and football is extremely popular. As the city becomes more of a tourist destination over time, it is also transforming into a global city with some beautiful sights, particularly along the coastline. The beaches are relatively sheltered due to islands not far off the coast and are a great place to escape from the overwhelming hustle and bustle of the city centre.



Safety and Security.

Lagos has long had a bad reputation regarding crime in the city. Despite this, it has become much safer, as the government has spent a great deal of money on improving security in the city with a more prominent police presence and security cameras.

Due to its location, Lekki is safer and more affluent. The bridges connecting it to the islands and mainland cut down the traffic (and cause jams!). The housing is more expensive, and mostly on private, secure estates; there is a marked police presence and many private security companies that are employed by businesses.

Expats are not usually victims of violent crimes, but keeping your possessions hidden is wise, as is avoiding walking in areas of the city that you do not know well late at night. There are a lot of beggars on the street and people may approach you to ask for money, but it is usually best to keep walking and ignore anyone who approaches.

Generally, the inhabitants of Lagos are friendly and welcoming and will help you if you ask for directions. Stick to the main streets as much as possible and avoid going off the beaten track. You may be stopped by the police, but they are unlikely to pressure you hard for money. If they ask if you have anything for them, then simply offer your best wishes and you will usually be waved on.

- Use your common sense.
- Listen to security briefings.
- Follow the advice of drivers and local staff.
- Don't go out alone.





Our Offer to You.

Remuneration

When we talk about salary, we ask you to think about what lands in your bank account at the end of the month – what you actually have to spend. In many countries, high salary offers do not look quite so good after deductions for taxes, rent, food, utilities, etc. The salary we offer is the money that you get into your account, and we look after everything else.

Our package includes:

- Salary (net after-tax which we take care of). A deduction is made for local salary payment in Naira
- Accommodation
- Utilities (water, electric, internet)
- Cleaning and laundry service
- Daily meals in Brooke Hall, the school dining room
- Annual flight allowance
- Start and end of contract baggage allowance
- Health insurance

Dependents

There are definitely opportunities to come and work at Charterhouse Lagos with dependents. If you have children, we can only offer free places if they meet our entrance criteria.

Accommodation

You will be allocated a 2 bedroom fully furnished apartment in the staff accommodation block on campus. We do not offer any alternative accommodation allowance; this is to ensure your safety and security.

The apartment contains a small kitchen so you can prepare meals if you want to, although Brooke Hall, our school dining facility offers 3 meals a day. Cleaning and laundry services are provided. We want you to focus on teaching and let our support services take care of the day-to-day issues for you.



Our Offer to You.

Health insurance

Currently, we work with an international insurer and the policy covers you across the globe, except the USA. Of course, there are certain limitations, and we will be happy to share more details with you. If you are a US citizen, we will also provide home country coverage. The policy is essentially pay and claim back (we do have ways around this in some hospitals in Lagos), and this is facilitated through an app. You can also access free online consultations. In addition, we have medical and nursing staff on-site during working hours. Local hospitals have been identified with a high standard of care.

Residence Permit

There is a lot of paperwork involved in obtaining a Residence Permit for the Federal Republic of Nigeria. We have consultants who support the process inside Nigeria, in the UK and internationally. Any costs that you incur will be refunded – please keep the receipts.

Security and transport

We will provide a bookable taxi service if you want to go out. We do not recommend local buses or other taxis. Regular security briefings will be provided by our on-site Security Manager.

Life on campus

The well-being of staff is of vital importance to us. We have reduced teaching timetables to allow more time for planning and preparation, as well as collaboration and professional learning. On-site, we have a staff lounge, a pool and a gym. We also organise trips into mainland Lagos at weekends and organise visits to local attractions.

Professional development

We have been careful to build in a generous Professional Learning and Development budget in our projections and this is a feature of our school. We believe that communities live, learn and grow together. There are many opportunities for professional growth and promotion, and we want you to develop your career with us. Charterhouse Lagos will continue to grow towards 1800 students, and we plan to open additional schools in the region which expect to be led by existing staff.
