#### Geoff....

My name is Geoff Worth. I am 37 years old and came to Pate's in September 2009 as Head of Physics. This was my second teaching position having previously worked for 5 years at a selective boys Grammar School in South West London. This was not an easy move as I thoroughly enjoyed my job at that school but working at Pate's has been more fantastic than I could have imagined. I myself went to a selective Grammar school and so I feel completely at home in this environment. Pate's is a fantastic professional and academic institution with a wonderfully friendly, almost family feel.

Since I joined Pate's I have had the huge privilege of leading possibly the highest achieving physics department in the country. I have taught a large number of students at A level (we regularly have over 150 students in the sixth from studying physics), as well as GCSE. I have enjoyed this enormously and still look forward to it every day. I have been on school trips overseas and many within the UK including CERN and Rutherford Appleton Labs. I have also been to Ireland twice on junior rugby tours. These are combined with taking rugby teams most Saturday mornings during the autumn term.

I am hugely grateful for the help and support I have received from a number of colleagues. I have been on numerous development days both in school and all over the country. I have also completed the National Professional Qualification for Senior Leadership Course. This course has really enabled me to follow through and deliver results on a wide selection of school life. This is a snapshot of what Pate's is like. All staff are supported to excel and should they wish, expand their portfolio of roles. In September 2010 I therefore took on the role of timetabling and Data Manager. I have really enjoyed this job as it suits my scientific and technical background. In September 2016 I was also given the opportunity to become Head of Science with oversight of the Biology, Chemistry, Physics and lower school (KS3) Science. This has been a hugely rewarding, supporting other staff in furthering science excellence.

As many staff at Pate's would agree, working here is an enormous privilege and one that I do not take lightly. Going the 'extra mile' in search of excellence is the default norm as we have complete autonomy to deliver the best results possible, in a supportive and encouraging environment. In summary it is an extraordinary place to work.





#### Meg....

Hi, my name is Meg; I am 27 years old and I teach Physical Education at Pate's. I arrived at Pate's in 2015 as an excited, if not a little daunted NQT, really looking forward to embracing the challenge! Pate's runs their own Newly Qualified and Recently Qualified Teacher programmes. The dedicated NQT mentor and support team facilitated my transition to Pate's and teaching competently on my own, brilliantly. I felt fully supported in the classroom, even when no one was around. SLT are committed to my ongoing professional development and have clearly valued its importance at this early stage in my career offering me time, and internal and external training when I have wanted it. This provision of professional development is widely offered and encouraged to all staff in school at all stages of their career and in all areas of school life.

One of the things that I value most about working about Pate's is that you don't earn responsibility by time in service, but by aptitude and enthusiasm to do the role well; I was offered the position of Head of Beaufort House in my NQT year, a huge honour after such a short time at Pate's and in the profession. The role gave me a new challenge, developing my skill-set across a wide range of extra-curricular activities, and also delivering assemblies to large numbers of pupils across all age ranges. It has allowed me to be involved in more whole- school activities and in doing so working with more staff and students. Since then I have been given the opportunity to additionally undertake a number of other roles around school in both Pastoral and Teaching and Learning areas. Management are always looking for ways to further staff and collectively we enjoy the prospect of taking on new challenges to develop our school.

It is a pleasure to be in the classroom at Pate's. Both staff and students clearly share a passion for learning. The pupil creativity and spark around school is contagious and makes teaching here so enjoyable. The classroom is only further supported by the outstanding extra-curricular provision. Alongside our thriving House System, the opportunities provided by music, drama, sports, arts, science and other subject clubs is exceptional. Participation levels are fantastic and it is always a pleasure to give up my free time to offer the large number of inter and intra school fixtures and training sessions.

#### Shirley....

I am a member of the support staff and work in the Development Office on fundraising campaigns, campus developments and alumni relations. I joined Pate's in September 2009, coming from a previous career in the military and the defence industry. Indeed! Why on earth did Pate's recruit me into a fundraising role? I'm still not sure I know the answer to that, but whatever the reason I am very grateful. I report directly to the Bursar. I have fundraising targets to achieve but these are developed in a collaborative process between myself and the Bursar, with full sight and explanation of the school's financial position. This enables me to have total belief and understanding in what I'm doing, which is crucial when I have to wear my heart on my sleeve when asking people for money!! I feel extremely lucky to be given the autonomy to define the fundraising direction for the school and be able to present this to the SLT and governors for approval. I am trusted to develop fundraising initiatives that fit with the Pate's ethos. So far our fundraising appeals have been very successful and I am convinced that the atmosphere of honesty, transparency and trust is key. I feel able to try things and if they don't work, I am able to review it and change direction without fear of criticism.

Work relating to Campus Developments ranges from crafting the bids in order to gain the funds to working with builders and architects on multi-million pound projects. This is a particularly busy part of the role but an extremely exciting one too. We have had a good rate of return of successful bids but when they fail there is of course personal disappointment and the inevitable self-criticism but only support and encouragement from other members of the team. There is an amazing ability at Pate's to brush off and move on; students are encouraged to develop the trait and staff demonstrate it! When projects do get the funds, I am very fortunate to then work on the school project team, to deliver it. This is a hugely rewarding part of the role, not to mention completely fascinating.

Alumni relations is an expanding area and alumni events demand weekend and evening commitments. I can always rely on the support of other members of staff at these events, and get the sense that is gladly given, whether it's the catering staff or the SLT. Even at the end of a long Saturday working, there are smiles! I also have the total privilege of working with our fabulous Parents' Association; an amazingly creative, resourceful, professional, proactive and downright great fun team of selfless, devoted volunteers. There is not a single word in that list that is superfluous to requirements! No wonder we have such amazing students, if this is the gene pool from where they come! As part of my role I meet many parents, alumni and former staff. I work with many volunteers who help the school usually from these same groups of people and whatever the connection with Pate's they seem to have an undefinable passion for the school. As corny as it sounds - Pate's gets into the blood.

On a personal note, I have 2 children and during my time at Pate's I have been able to flex my time so that I have not missed a nativity play, a sports day, a school show or at the other end of the scale a university open day or graduation ceremony. I joined Pate's as Sixth Form Manager in 2011, and the first task I was given was to oversee the Sixth Form Charity Christmas lunch. I watched staff from all areas of the school donning festive aprons and serving turkey and all the trimmings to the whole of the sixth form, and I had a good feeling about my new job. Seven years later, my first impressions have proved to be accurate: this is a great place to work! For me, one of the best thing about working at Pate's is the variety that my role offers and the exhilarating pace of a Pate's school week. I can truly say that no day is ever the same, and, whilst the backbone of the job may be office administration, I have been encouraged and supported to extend my role far beyond that, into pastoral support, EPQ supervision, UCAS reference writing, event-management and beyond.

I don't under-estimate how fortunate I am to work in an environment that pays far more than lip service to personal development and that is always ready to listen and work with staff in order to meet their needs.

Hi, my name is Sophie and I am going into my 6th year of teaching at Pate's. I joined in September 2012 as an NQT maths teacher. The support I received from both my department and the rest of the teaching staff was great and I really enjoyed getting to watch some inspirational lessons as part of my ongoing training.

The maths department is the biggest department in the school and everyone is very supportive of each other both professionally and personally. We have autonomy over all of our lessons but are always sharing great resources and ideas with each other.
