Terms and Conditions

- Duration: 1 year placement (September 2021 July 2022)
- Hours: Term time only (39 weeks) 8.30–16.30 plus some evenings/weekends
- Remuneration: National Living Wage [£8.91 p/hr]

Main Tasks and Responsibilities

- Managing and maintaining the music facilities computer suites, midi keyboards, instrument stock, amplifiers, microphones, leads, etc.
- Assisting in KS3 (Year 7-9), KS4 (GCSE) and KS5 (A Level) lessons through technical support as well as working with pupils on lesson tasks
- To record and collate GCSE / A Level coursework ready for submission
- Live mixing and recording of all concerts usually one per week
- To aid students in the use of amplification and recording equipment
- To take part in, support and lead extra-curricular activities
- To attend a number of residential and day trips throughout the year
- To support the music teaching and administrative staff with the day-to-day running of the music department
- There is an opportunity for a suitable candidate to take on extra paid work teaching music theory classes.
- There is also scope for the music and sound technician to develop other projects and initiatives. Previous technicians have run ensembles, set up sound recording clubs, developed the music archives, been responsible for the department's social media, and pioneered an annual music festival.
