Purpose of the role

To work as part of the professional intimate personal care team across the full age range of children in school (2-19 years, male and female). To work with teachers as part of a professional team to support teaching and learning for SEN pupils. Providing learning support to pupils who need particular help to overcome barriers to learning, such as those with moderate, severe, profound and multiple learning difficulties and/or behavioural, social, communication, sensory or physical disabilities.

Responsibilities

- 1.Attend to pupils' personal needs including toileting, hygiene, dressing and feeding, as well as help with social, welfare and health matters, reporting problems to the teacher as appropriate.
- 2. Work with individuals or groups of pupils in the classroom under the direct supervision of teaching staff and provide feedback to the teacher
- 3. Work with pupils on therapy or care programmes, designed and supervised by a therapist/care professional
- 4. Support pupils to understand instructions support independent learning and inclusion of all pupils
- 5. Support the teacher in behaviour management and keeping pupils on task
- 6. Physically assist pupils in activities (may involve hoisting/lifting, where mobility is an issue)
- 7. Requires the regular manoeuvring of pupils with severe physical disabilities.
- 8. Prepare and clear up the learning environment and resources and contribute to maintaining a safe learning environment, including photocopying, filing and the display and presentation of pupils' work.
- 9.Responsible for the careful and safe use of specialist equipment e.g. standing frames, sensory equipment
- 10. Maintain confidentiality and adhere to safeguarding procedures
- 11. Working with individuals, small groups and/or whole classes of pupils where work is regularly interrupted, which requires switching from one activity to another.

Special Support Assistants at this level may also:

- 1.Administer medication in accordance with an agreed plan under direct supervision of healthcare practitioner and following appropriate training use of gastrostomy tubes and PEGS for feeding
- 2. Record basic pupil data
- 3. Support children's learning through play
- 4. Assist with break-time supervision including facilitating games and activities
- 5. Assist with escorting pupils on educational visits
- 6. May demonstrate own duties to new or less experienced staff.
