


## JAMES ALLEN'S GIRLS' SCHOOL

### TECHNICAL THEATRE MANAGER

## Essential

- The ability to work safely at height and with theatre lighting and sound equipment.
- Experience in operating lighting and sound equipment, and some knowledge of their programming preferred.
- Adaptable in approach and willing to 'go the extra mile'.
- Flexible and versatile, able to work with imagination and ingenuity supporting young people in their new skills and techniques.
- The ability to work to deadlines, using their own initiative, is essential.

## Desirable

- Confident and able to work both unsupervised and as a member of a team.
- Excellent communication skills, including being able to deal effectively with teaching staff, pupils, parents and colleagues.









### DRAMA DEPARTMENT

The JAGS Drama department comprises five highly experienced specialist teachers, a Theatre Technician, a Performing Arts Assistant, Director in Residence and two LAMDA Teachers. We share our passion for this subject in delivering both curricular and extra-curricular activities, which include exciting design, technical and performance opportunities throughout the year. Pupils regularly achieve the highest grades in both practical and written examinations. We celebrate excellence in ensemble as well as individual achievement. We actively encourage senior girls to take the initiative and run drama clubs for younger pupils. We also steer pupils to work in local and national theatre companies such as NYT, NYMT and Young Pleasance. We have frequent requests from casting agents to come into school and several of our pupils have been selected for film and television roles. Girls also work with the local community running dance and drama workshops in local primary schools. JAGS also actively encourages teachers to pursue their own theatre practice beyond the school environment.

Drama teachers have considerable scope to develop their individual enthusiasms and teaching methods. In Years 7,8 and 9 pupils have a drama lesson weekly. The aim is to inspire a love for drama and knowledge and understanding of theatre skills, with increasing independence in the demonstration of such skills. In Years 10 – 11 there are three groups in each year and we currently follow the AQA syllabus. Pupils work towards a range of scripted and devised practical options supported by written coursework. The productions we see during the course fuel the creative projects we undertake and always fire the imaginations of the students. We follow the AQA syllabus at A Level with papers on set texts and practitioners, live theatre and practical performances. There are up to twenty projects created by the girls in any academic year.

The Drama department is always a hive of activity. We have a 200 seat auditorium, a flexible stage and professional lighting and sound facilities. We also have a fully equipped studio theatre two dance studios, a design room, workshop, scene store and costume store. We challenge the pupils to work to professional standards in an atmosphere of creative collaboration. Our staff-directed productions are mounted through the year; the Autumn term for Years 10 - 13, Spring term for three Year 7 productions and a dance show and the Summer term for a Year 10 Production and a Year 8 – 9 production. Year 12 direct Junior House Drama in the Autumn term. We often do co- productions with Dulwich College. Dance is taught within Drama at Key stage 3 and is an individual option in key stage 4 and 5. We provide a wide range of clubs from technical theatre through to playwriting. We offer gifted and talented pupils extra opportunities: some of the excellent ensemble choreography was done by a sixth former on a recent Junior Show and we often have an assistant director working on the productions. Many girls are members of the technical crew and costume department. Girls have often had the opportunity to take part in new work at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival as performers and technicians.

Working in the Drama department at JAGS is both enjoyable and demanding; Staff should be committed and energetic and make a lively contribution to the cultural life of the school.
