What Will I be doing?

Job description and details

Contract: Part-time, Permanent, Term-Time

Hours: 31.25 hours per week for both roles, 45.2weeks per year (term-time only)

Location: Gossops Green Primary School – Crawley, West Sussex

Reporting to: Assistant Principal (KS1 or KS2)

Purpose of the Post: To support children with their educational, emotional and social development;

working alongside the class teacher and other colleagues to help children

reach their full potential.

Main Responsibilities

a) To support the ethos of the school

- To ensure the well-being of the children in your care and nurture their self esteem
- To model and promote positive attitudes
- To promote and adhere to the behaviour policy of the school
- To assist in maintaining an attractive and calm learning environment
- To be prepared to attend appropriate supervision and in-service training
- Any other reasonable request of the Principal
- To act as an excellent role model
- Managing pupil anxiety and behaviour
- Meeting personal care and medical needs, where required

b) To support effective learning

- Work in collaboration with the teaching team
- Take responsibility for delivering teaching groups of children or 1:1
- To prepare resources as directed
- Liaise with family and carers as appropriate in relation to learning
- Mark and respond to children's work
- Supporting the least able pupils and stretching the most able pupils using scaffolding, prompting and modelling
- Explaining teacher feedback to pupils
- Breaking down, recapping and adapting the teacher's content or tasks appropriately for individual pupils

c) To support effective lunch and break time provision

- To assist in supervising lunch and break duties
- To organise and support the children in playing constructively together, interacting positively with the pupils
- To support the play managers and play leaders in their roles during lunch
- To encourage the children to have good table manners and to behave appropriately in the dining hall
- To encourage children to play safely and imaginatively with equipment and to tidy it away carefully at the end of the session

The above is not an exhaustive list, and the successful applicant may be required to carry out additional duties as required by the role.
