Job Purpose

Teaching & Learning (BSO: Quality of Education)

- Teach **Psychology** across KS4 (GCSE/IGCSE) and KS5 (A Level).
- Teach another **Humanities** subject in KS3 and Ideally in KS4.
- Use a range of teaching strategies, including practical and investigative work, to promote scientific thinking and enquiry.
- Differentiate effectively to meet the needs of all learners, including **EAL pupils** and those with additional learning needs.
- Maintain high expectations for pupil behaviour, engagement, and achievement in line with school policies.

Curriculum & Assessment (BSO: Curriculum & Achievement)

- Deliver the Humanities curriculum in accordance with **National Curriculum** and exam board specifications (Pearson/Edexcel).
- Deliver the **Psychology** syllabus in GSCE and AS/A level.



- Prepare pupils thoroughly for **external examinations**, including practical endorsements where applicable.
- Use formative and summative assessment to track progress and inform teaching.
- Analyse assessment data to identify underachievement and implement targeted interventions.
- Ensure accurate and timely marking, feedback, and reporting in line with school policy.

Sixth Form Psychology (Desirable)

- Teach **A Level Psychology**, fostering independent learning, critical thinking, and exam readiness.
- Support Sixth Form pupils with **extended practical work, research skills, and academic writing**.
- Contribute to **UCAS references**, academic mentoring, and guidance for STEM-related university pathways.

Practical Humanities & Health and Safety (BSO: Leadership & Management / Safeguarding)

- Plan and supervise safe, effective practical lessons in accordance with **UK and international health and safety standards**.
- Ensure compliance with safety procedures and risk assessments.
- Always model and enforce safe practices.
