At the British School of Vilnius, we believe that all children are unique individuals who all have differing abilities, ambitions and potential. We tailor all aspects of our curriculum to help our children make the most of their time in school.

We offer the English National Curriculum with a twist, placing an emphasis on globally relevant topics and skills for the 21st Century.

Early Years

In Early Years the children follow the EYFS Framework with a very integrated, flexible and play based approach to learning.

We focus on the whole child ensuring positive relationships, stimulating learning environments, critical thinking and high expectations. Play is a very important part of our curriculum delivery and learning is introduced through a mixture of carefully planned opportunities for child initiated and adult-led focused activities. Children's interests are explored, and we introduce new ideas and learning. Specialist teachers deliver a compressive Lithuanian, Spanish, Music and PE curriculum. We want our early years children to go home and say, 'We have been playing all day!' This means we have made their learning fun and enjoyable!

Primary

Our Primary curriculum is comprehensive, thematic and creative, with clear learning processes and specific learning goals. It is based upon the National Curriculum of England and enhanced through a topic-based approach. We ensure our learning programme is academically rigorous, but is also exciting, active and meaningful for children. We encourage personal learning - cooperation, communication, resilience, thoughtfulness, respect, and morality - and we promote international mindedness.

Six-week units cover a range of themes which are relevant and appropriate for different age groups. For example, younger children's learning includes topics such as 'Holidays' or 'Toys' which enable children to draw on their own direct experiences. Older children study more complex topics, such as learning about 'Weather and Climate' or finding out about 'The Human Body'.

The priority within our Key Stage 1 classes is to ensure that each child's experiences of school are happy and exciting. Our children are encouraged to develop their creative and physical talents, to think independently and to actively solve problems using their own invention and imagination.

Academic achievement is highly valued at The British School of Vilnius and secure foundations are laid in Literacy, Numeracy,

Science and Information Communication Technology (ICT). The school emphasises the importance of traditional educational standards and core skills such as reading and number work are a standard feature of the school day. Students are introduced to specialist teaching in Languages, Physical Education and Music. A variety of assessment and continuous monitoring of our children's development continues throughout their time in KS1.



The solid academic groundwork which is laid down in Key Stage 1 acts as a springboard for further development throughout our children's primary school careers. The school curriculum is designed to allow each of our children to realise their full potential. The curriculum is structured to ensure every child is stretched, challenged and supported when necessary. Our students' progress is closely monitored at all stages using a variety of internal and external assessments.

At Key Stage 2, core subjects continue to be literacy and numeracy, but as children progress through KS2, they receive increasing levels of specialist teaching in subjects such as Languages, Science, Information Communication Technology, Art, Music and Physical Education.

We think it's important to educate the 'whole child'. Personal, Social Health Education is part of this. We teach it at all Key Stages, equipping students with the knowledge, skills and understanding to take responsibility for themselves, show respect for others and develop self-awareness and confidence.



World Leading Schools



Secondary

The first year of the Secondary School at The British School of Vilnius is Year 7. Together with Year 8 and Year 9, this forms Key Stage 3, where all pupils follow an enhanced learning programme based upon the UK National Curriculum.

The move from the Primary School to the Secondary School is an important moment, where pupils take on increased independence and responsibility. Our curriculum - the subjects we offer, and what goes on in lessons day in, day out - will be key process behind our successful outcomes.

Key Stage 3 builds on the learning that has taken place in the Primary School and develops this further so that all students can be successful and independent learners when measured against national and international standards.

Pupils follow a two-week timetable cycle (Week A/Week B) of six lessons per day. Each lesson is 50 minutes. A combination of single and double lessons is used to maximise learning time whilst promoting frequent exposure to a breadth of different subjects.

Information and Communication Technology (ICT) is integrated across the curriculum, as a tool for learning, as well as teaching it as a discrete subject. Mathematics is the only subject where pupils are placed in classes according to ability, to ensure appropriate levels of challenge and support.

Key Stage 3 pupils will sit annual exams at the end of each year, across their core subjects, which help monitor and assess performance as they progress towards their IGCSE examinations at the end of Year 11.

Underpinning the pupil's education is their access to many off-timetable co-curricular activities, encouraging them to be adventurous and curious both in and outside of the classroom.

The academic year 2021-22 will be our first year of secondary education and the school will continue to grow adding additional classes to our secondary. There will be comprehensive planning in all subjects to ensure continiuty of learning through each Key Stage including the selection of IGCSE options AS/A Level and vocational qualifications.





Work life Balance

In compact and cosy Vilnius, we measure distances in minutes, not hours. With most of what we need close by and no long commute times eating into your day, there's more time here for the things that matter most.

With a well-developed public transport network, fresh natural surroundings, and a walkable city centre, getting around is easy and pleasant. In fact, Vilnius can be as relaxed or dynamic as you want it to be.

Looking for a rollicking night out? Our city centre is full of fun and affordable spots that cater to all tastes. Hankering for a quick escape into nature? Fields, forests, parks and tree-lined squares abound and are never more than minutes away. Active leisure (swimming, sailing, hiking, golfing, biking, boating, wakeboarding...even skiing

Getting in and out of the city is a breeze. Bus and railway stations are centrally located. Vilnius International Airport is a mere 15-minute drive from the Centre with direct flights to more than 40 destinations throughout Europe and beyond.

Getting Around

Buses, trolleybuses, electric scooters and CycloCity bikes are the most common forms of public transport in Vilnius.

For the most convenient access to public transport, you can obtain a Vilnian Card ("Vilniečio kortelė") – a prepaid travel card that can be used on all public transport. These can be bought at supermarkets and newsstands.

Individual tickets can also be bought for €1 and are valid for an hour.

Restaurants

For centuries, Vilnius has been home to various cultures bringing their own culinary heritages to the city. These days, the city's restaurants offer much more than traditional old-world cuisine. The streets of the city are filled with aromas from all over the world, hinting to contemporary flavour combinations and modern food preparation techniques.

Locally sourced produce can perform small miracles that make for big surprises. Vilnius' restaurants focus on seasonal cuisine, improvisation, and unique culinary experiences. And though they differ in flavours, concepts and traditions, they're all contributing to the city's budding food scene, which takes guests on delicious flavour filled adventures. No matter which restaurant you choose, you're guaranteed to enjoy the flavours of Vilnius.

Nightlife


