Students' standards of achievement in public examinations at GCSE and A level are excellent.

The results in summer 2020 show that BSG stays firmly in the premier league of UK secondary schools. At 'A' level 83.81% of passes were at Grades A\* to B.

Results at GCSE were equally impressive. Particularly satisfying was the fact that 70.3% of all passes were at the highest 7-9 grades.

This makes BSG one of the top performing state schools in the southwest and nationally. We were again amongst the top performing state schools nationally.

However, we are not only concerned with achieving outstanding examination success. Excellence in all its forms is encouraged, whether it is on the sports field, on the stage, in music or in the arts. A personal sense of self-respect and responsibility is fostered and each individual in the community is valued. Pastoral responsibility lies with the Form Staff whose work is co-ordinated by Heads of House and the Head of Sixth Form; almost all full-time teachers have responsibility for a form. There is a thriving Careers Department and all girls participate in a Work Experience programme in Year 10 and the Sixth Form. A wide variety of extra-curricular activities flourish; many are run by senior pupils for the benefit of the younger ones, but all have staff support. Bournemouth School for Girls is an 11-18 selective school for girls, admitting pupils from Bournemouth and the surrounding area. Since August 2011 we have had academy status. The school was founded in 1918; the majority of the present building dates from 1960 with the addition of a Science Block in 1994 and a 12-classroom block which was opened in January 1998. A further two-classroom building was opened in December 1999. A new Performing Arts Centre has brought a further boost to the school's accommodation, with top class facilities for Music and Drama. We have also completed a new building to house Art and the Social Sciences. We are currently completing an exciting new project to improve facilities in PE and Design & Technology.

Departmental classrooms are grouped together and all have access to interactive whiteboard and video facilities. All departments also have access to a central IT suite of classrooms which have been the target of major investment in recent years.

There are 1196 girls on roll, including over 300 in the Sixth Form.

We have strong links with the wider community, locally, nationally and internationally. We are designated a National Support School and a member of several teaching school partnerships. We are also an outward looking school. We are a member school of the South West Academic Trust, a group of grammar schools in the southwest working together with Exeter University.

Girls follow the National Curriculum, with the addition of a second modern language (German) from Year 8. At Key Stage 4, all girls study 10 GCSE subjects, including Triple Science. Compulsory non-examination subjects throughout are Personal and Social Education and Physical Education. In the Sixth Form, girls in Year 12 study 3 or 4 subjects (chosen from the 27 subjects on offer). In Year 13 girls continue with 3 or 4 A levels. Many girls also complete an EPQ.

There are at present 41 full-time and 31 part-time teachers assisted by an excellent support staff. The staff are friendly and supportive. There is no smoking anywhere in the school, including the staff area. Teachers are expected to share in some supervisory duties, but these are not onerous.

Staff development is an important priority within the school and staff take full advantage of CPD opportunities within school, locally and nationally. There is an induction programme to support new colleagues, whether they are a NQT, or more experienced colleagues.

Bournemouth is a very pleasant place in which to live with attractive beaches, proximity to the New Forest and the Dorset Heritage Coast and fast road and rail access to London. Sporting and cultural activities in the area are of a high standard. Housing is available in all price ranges.
