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

annual Rotary Club Youth Speaks Competition. Hannah Williams, Tom Sowden and Anthony Bedale planned and delivered an excellent set of



Attendance

We wish to appoint Examination Invigilators on a casual basis to cover examination periods throughout the academic year invigilating both GCSE and internal examinations. You will be required to work as part of a team committed

to achieving the best possible outcomes for our young people and be willing to support students through the provision, supervision and monitoring of examinations. You will be employed on a casual basis (start and finish times to be agreed with the Examination Officer) but will need to be fully flexible during the exam period. Examination schedules will be provided prior to the exam period.

Our team works well together to help create a positive working environment to support our students during their exams. You must be reliable, punctual, be able to relate to other invigilators, staff members and students in a calm manner. Full training will be provided. DBS checks will apply.

PARKING PROBLEMS OUTSIDE SCHOOL

We have received numerous complaints from our neighbours about a minority of parents who cause major problems through careless driving or inconsiderate parking when dropping off or waiting to collect their children; in particular Woodbourne and The Running Stream Public House car park.

As a school we value the maintenance of good relationships with the local community and would ask all parents to support us. Sometimes cars obstruct driveways, park illegally close to junctions, or make it difficult for the school buses to manoeuvre safely.

Our local councillors and the neighbourhood police officers have asked us to draw attention to these problems and they will be taking action to enforce the law.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

ATTENDANCE—ABSENCES DURING TERM TIME

In accordance with Local Authority guidelines All Hallows Catholic School cannot authorise holidays during term time. Please be aware that should you request a leave of absence for your child/children which is not authorised, the Educational Welfare Service may be informed and a Penalty Notice may be issued.

The penalty is £60 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice, rising to £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days of receipt of the notice. If the penalty is not paid by the end of the 28-day period, the Local Authority will prosecute the recipient for failing to ensure the regular school attendance of their child under section 444 Education Act 1996. Please be aware that each parent is liable to receive a Penalty Notice for each child who incurs unauthorised absences, for example, if there are two parents and two children, each parent will receive two Penalty Notices.

Attendance has a direct effect on learning and achievement and we all want the very best for your child/children.

CHAPLAINCY TEAM
