British College La Cañada is located in La Cañada (Valencia) - a beautiful urbanisation north-west of the city of Valencia. From primary and secondary buildings you have stunning views of the mountains, normally accompanied by bright blue sky! Valencia's proximity to the Mediterranean Sea is one of the high points of life in Spain's third largest city. Located along a coastline rich in top quality beaches, living in and around Valencia you will enjoy fabulous Mediterranean climates.

British College La Cañada is situated within a large, leafy location approximately 15 kilometres from Valencia city centre. The area enjoys good transport links, and offers several options to travel to and from the city. Valencia airport is situated only 7 kilometres from the school, and the metro line has two stations: one in La Cañada town centre and one in the northern part of La Vallesa. Both are situated roughly 2.5 kilometres from the school. Most members of staff drive to work; for those who do not have their own car, arrangements are made amongst staff to carpool and share lifts (staff arrange amongst themselves to cover petrol costs). Only a stone's throw from Valencia city centre, La Cañada's peaceful surroundings, clean air and natural environment make this an attractive outlying town in which to work.

How the school is organised

The school consists of four main buildings: an infant building, a two storey primary building, a three storey secondary building and a new modern university style sixth form building. The school has a two (and in some cohorts a three) form entry from Nursery, through to Foundation, Key Stage 1, Key Stage 2 and Key Stage 3,4 and 5. All classrooms are light, spacious and have states-of-the-art facilities.

At present, we have approximately 800 pupils on roll across Primary and Secondary. The children are mainly from Spanish speaking families, so the only English most of them get is at school. There are approximately 26 children to each class and in Foundation Stage and Year 1 there are two staff members per class, a teacher and a T.A. From Year 2 to

Year 6, there is an assistant that is shared between the two classes. In Secondary, pupils benefit from a personal tutor who oversees their day-to-day personal and academic wellbeing matters.

The curriculum is rich and students have the opportunity to choose from a wide range of options at IGCSE.

Students in 6th form have direct access to British, International and Spanish Universities as they study 4 A Levels, as well as career specific spanish subjects.

There are sports courts and playgrounds, along with a swimming pool, sports' hall and theatre. The school has an independent dining room with its own kitchen.

In a short period of time, our primary school has successfully gained **B.S.O accreditation**. The last inspection was completed in November 2021. In addition, the Secondary school has recently had an extremely successful NABSS inspection.

Contracts

All teaching posts come with a permanent contract and work from September to the end of June, thus enjoying a long summer holiday in July and August, with the option to work July for an additional payment.



Social Security

Spanish income tax is deducted automatically. Staff do not need to worry about organising this as the school makes full social security payments for all staff, meaning that teachers have immediate access, upon registering as a resident, to health care services in Spain.

Staff Induction

Moving schools, as well as countries, can be a daunting experience, which is why we provide assistance with all matters relating to feeling settled in the school and in Valencia. The school supports teachers in all areas, including completing all the necessary paperwork requirements, opening bank accounts and finding accommodation.



Professional development

Professional development is essential to ensure that teachers feel that they have the opportunity to improve whilst working at the school. Opportunities are accessed in a number of different ways; internal sharing of best practice, C.D.D courses, online courses including first aid and safeguarding. In addition, every year teachers are invited to the conference held by the National Association of British Schools in Spain. The weekend consists of a wide variety of courses, as well as a great opportunity to network and share ideas.



Teachers with children

There are no fees for staff children and there are generous discounts for uniform and lunch.

Lunch

All teachers receive a hot buffet meal at lunch, where vegetarian, vegan and other dietary needs can be met. This can be enjoyed in the staff dining room or terrace.

Medical Insurance

There is optional subsidised private medical insurance with special conditions which covers general illness and dentistry.



A strong committed team

We are proud to boast an amazing team of teachers who are committed to continuously improving the school and striving for what is best for our students. We have both new and experienced members of staff who share ideas and support each other in all aspects of school and personal life.



Conditions of services

The conditions of service are determined by the Spanish national agreement for private schools, known as the 'convenio'. However, at British College La Cañada we offer a competitive salary for this region of Spain and all teachers begin their first year with a salary above the Spanish convenio. We have also introduced an incentive scheme which includes salary increments that reward years of commitment and service to our school. These increments will be made upon successful completion of a satisfactory end of year appraisal.

We want our new teachers to feel happy and secure in their new home city and workplace; we will provide new teachers with a peer mentor to help with the settling in process. They will be on hand to offer friendly, peer to peer, advice and support to do with matters relating to school procedures and ethos, places to see and visit, or even where to find the cheapest beer and tapas!



LIVING IN VALENCIA



Accommodation in Valencia city is approximately 600 euros per month for a 2 bedroom flat. Living right in the city centre may cost considerably more, whilst living in the suburbs or villages surrounding Valencia is a cheaper option.

Cost of living

If you choose to share that could reduce your living costs considerably. Internet and mobile phone tariffs vary but would cost on average 50 euros a month, on top of this there will be water, electricity and possibly gas bills, depending on how the flat is organised. Most letting agents in Spain require a deposit (the bond), plus an initial month's rent as well as one month's rent equivalent as the agency fee. Please bear this in mind as you could need three times the rental price prior to moving in! Water is around 60 euros every two months and gas and electricity will vary depending on the property and number of occupants.
