

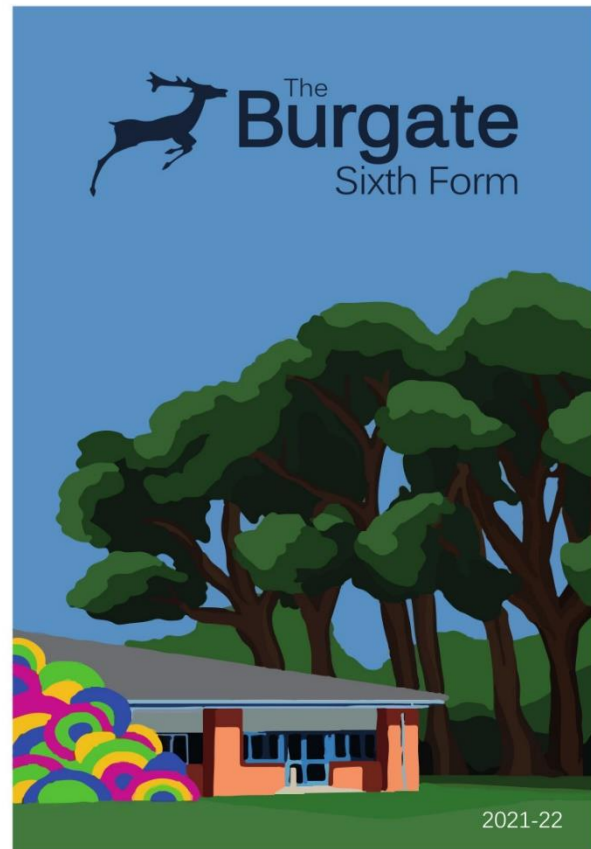

The Post

We are seeking to appoint a dynamic, ambitious individual who will promote and contribute to the continued development of our sixth form provision. We have approximately 250 students in the sixth form, who are overseen by the Head of Sixth Form, supported by the Deputy Head of Sixth Form and a Pastoral Support Team. We are extremely proud of recent recognition from Ofsted who graded the sixth form 'outstanding' in May 2019; this truly is an excellent opportunity for a first-rate practitioner to lead the sixth form to further success.

Teaching commitment (no preference for subject offered) is likely to be around 0.5 FTE and there will also be a commitment to be in college at the time of A level results and on GCSE results day when students make final sixth form course decisions. This is likely to be a total of four days in the summer holidays.

Our Sixth Form

The Burgate Sixth Form opened in 1996 and since its inception has always been recognised as an outstanding centre for academic learning. Outcomes for our students are consistently above the national average, and the last external examinations in 2019 were no exception, with a value added progress score of +0.29 and an average grade of 'B', ranking us in the top 10% of 16-19 providers nationally. 53% of A level results were at A*-B grade and over 81% at grades A*-C, with almost all students gaining a place at their chosen university.

Our consistent results are due to the high quality, engaging teaching we provide and the strong relationships built between staff and students. The recent Ofsted report stated *"The quality of teaching, learning and assessment is excellent in the sixth form. Teachers have high expectations and know the students very well. Consequently, work is well matched to students' needs and they receive very helpful feedback and support."*

Our curriculum is based on student choice and students typically choose three A Levels over the two years. We offer a range of over 30 A levels as well as a small number of vocational qualifications and the Extended Project Qualification. All students receive nine hours of teaching per subject per fortnight, with an hour a week directed study per subject monitored by our sixth form support team, as well as dedicated tutor lessons each week.

Our teachers are highly qualified specialists who are committed to providing the best possible lessons with clearly defined learning outcomes. We attach great importance to the development of a wide range of stimulating teaching strategies. In this way we seek to equip all of our students with the skills they need to learn independently and adapt to change so that they will have the flexibility and confidence they need to meet the demands of the modern world.

The Wider Sixth Form Curriculum

The Burgate Sixth Form is, however, about much more than academic learning and we encourage our students to get involved in activities which will enable them to become well-rounded individuals able to make a difference in the world. There is great scope for involvement in numerous extra-curricular activities, ranging from sport to debating and visiting speakers to international trips. All students are expected to engage in one community hour and one enrichment hour per week and Wednesday afternoons provide opportunity for

work experience, community service, PE and activities such as first aid or peer mentoring. Wider enrichment is an area we are looking to develop and improve going forward.

Student voice has a significant role in the life of the sixth form and we have a very active student council who take responsibility for social and charitable activities. The sixth form has been praised for preparing students well for the next stage in their life; all students are supported both academically and pastorally by their tutor and this bond is key for their future development, particularly in preparation for university, apprenticeships and job applications.

The Sixth Form Facilities

The sixth form is separate to the main school and the students enjoy the college atmosphere that this offers. It has its own social area with cafeteria service, extensive recreational areas (playing fields and MUGA) as well as plenty of outdoor seating areas. Students have access to a quiet workroom with computers and also a collaborative study area. Additionally, there is a wellbeing room where students can meet with our pastoral support leader or external counselling agencies.

Location

The Burgate School and Sixth Form is situated on the outskirts of Fordingbridge, in Hampshire. Salisbury, Bournemouth, Southampton and the Channel ports of Poole and Portsmouth are all within easy driving distance, and the major cities of Bath, Bristol and London all easily accessible by road and rail. With the New Forest National Park, Isle of Purbeck, Jurassic Coast and Salisbury Plain further enriching and enhancing the natural beauty of the local environment, the successful candidate will have a chance to live and teach in one of the most highly desirable areas of England, where the standard of living is of the best available nationally.

It is the role of the Head of Sixth Form to lead and manage the teams responsible for the development of sixth form students. The Head of Sixth Form will have the responsibility for the operational management of the sixth form and be active in leading the academy's aims and supporting an ethos that promotes achievement and high standards.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Leadership of the Sixth Form
- Ensure a high quality of pastoral care and student support in the sixth form
- Enhance students' academic performance through rigorous monitoring of progress
- Recruitment and retention of sixth form students

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- To lead, manage and monitor the work of the Deputy Head of Sixth Form, Pastoral Support Leader and Sixth Form Tutor Team
- To lead on the development of the Sixth Form Improvement Plan
- To lead sixth form student wellbeing and mental health
- To work with Deputy Headteacher to ensure that all safeguarding procedures are in place and being followed
- To lead sixth form attendance procedures and monitoring
- To deal with student disciplinary matters
- To liaise with parents, staff, SENDCO and external agencies to support students
- To liaise with Deputy Headteacher to monitor and support student academic progress
- To liaise with Assistant Headteacher to ensure high quality teaching and learning in the sixth form
- To review A level results in August and conduct A level subject consultations on GCSE results day
- Post 18 transition: oversee all aspects of reference writing and lead the UCAS process and non UCAS processes
- To oversee the sixth form co-curricular programme, including university visits, lectures and other enrichment and extra-curricular activities
- To lead on the student leadership programme (e.g. Sixth Form Student Council)
- To be involved in the production of the sixth form prospectus, associated publications and the sixth form area of the website
- To lead on Sixth Form recruitment
 - To organise and run the Sixth Form Open Evening for students and parents and other events as appropriate, in liaison with the Deputy Headteacher
 - To organise and run induction programmes for new entrants to the sixth form (Taster Days, Freshers Day)
 - To work with Year 11 tutors and students (both Burgate and other feeder schools) to ensure the smooth transfer of students to the sixth form
 - To organise and run sixth form social events
