Shortlisting

Shortlisting will take place on **Wednesday 15th September 2021**. Only those candidates meeting the specified criteria will be taken forward from application. Please be advised that in accordance with safer recruitment protocols, references will be taken up for shortlisted candidates, and where necessary, employers may be contacted to gather further information.

Interview and Selection Process

Those shortlisted will take part in an in-depth interview process on Monday 27th and Tuesday 28th September. Candidates will be asked to account for any discrepancies, anomalies or gaps in their application documentation.

About Our School

St Catherine's RC Primary is a voluntary aided Catholic school located in the suburb of Didsbury in South Manchester. Our two-form entry school caters for 3-11 year olds and at present has 439 children on roll.

The school site is adjacent to the large parish church of St Catherine of Siena and is part of a thriving and active local community. The children are hardworking and standards of behaviour are excellent. Our staff and Governing Body are committed and work hard to meet the needs of our children. Our parents are supportive and the school has an established and active PTA.

It is a significant period of time since our last Ofsted inspection in 2009. The Lead Inspector observed that:

"This is an outstanding school that serves its community exceptionally well and, consequently, has gained the support of the overwhelming majority of parents."

Our challenge has been to continually develop our school from this point. We are committed to giving our children the best possible education, in its widest sense. This goes beyond the National Curriculum. We have the privilege of preparing the children, not only for the next stage in their education, but also for life. The skills, knowledge and understanding are built on year by year at the same time as nurturing and supporting the growth of the whole child. Initiatives, such as forest school, have helped to bring a different dimension to our school and through our staff, supported by our Caritas Social Worker, we are advocates for our most vulnerable children, but also all those who need a helping hand.

St. Catherine's is a 'Rights Respecting School' and we have progressed from Bronze (Rights Committed) to the Silver Award (Rights Aware) and our focus has now turned toward achieving Gold (Rights Respecting). Our children have a wonderful sense of justice and Rights Respecting has empowered them further.

Religious Education is a thread which runs through every aspect of our school. This underpins our entire curriculum and school as we strive to instil in all our pupils a real sense of belonging to the Family of God. It is a joy to work in partnership with St. Catherine's Parish to prepare our children to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist in Year 3. Our GIFT Team take a leading role in worship and liturgy which empowers them to take their mission into action.

We are delighted to hold the International Schools Award Gold which recognises our strength in Languages and the cultural dimension of our community. Curriculum provision focuses on Spanish and in Year 5 the children have the opportunity to visit Nigran in northern Spain. This exchange visit is a real highlight of the year, not only for the children and families who go to Spain, but for the whole school community, especially when we welcome our Spanish friends to St. Catherine's.

We are proud of our sporting achievements but also the extent of the provision for children to participate in sport. There is a wide-ranging programme of extra-curricular activities. Music is a further strength, demonstrated by our choir performing at the One Manchester Concert and at Young Voices. Instrumental music tuition is provided in Year 2, 3, 4 and 5 with all children learning the tin whistle, ukulele and guitar. Children are also given the chance to learn other instruments, particularly woodwind, through group and individual tuition.

The impact of educational visits is without question. These sometimes provide the hook into learning or at other times they are the catalyst for further development.

Liaison with and between schools is important to us and we have built a network of 'school to school' support within our area through a series of local school clusters. We have a very good partnership with The Barlow RC High School, the Secondary school where the majority of our pupils go after leaving St. Catherine's. We also have a strong partnership with the Local Authority and Salford Diocese.
