Value Added Results Published This Week

This week the official Value Added GL results were published for schools. SCS has returned results in line with the very best UK and international schools. They are hugely impressive. They demonstrate the significant and exceptional input secondary teachers at SCS have added to the GCSE outcomes for all of our students last year.

In short: SCS has, as you will see below, added remarkable value to students' results. The results show that our students have significantly outperformed their CAT4 (Cognitive Ability Test) potentials.

What is Value Added? How is it Measured?

Many schools measure and benchmark attainment using student results. Value added (VA) is a fairer and more accurate measure of school performance which takes into account the starting point of each student (a CAT4 assessment) as well as the students' outcomes (i/GCSE or other qualifications).


Figure 1: GCSE results for students achieving <u>5 or more</u> grades at levels 9-4 including level 4 or above in English and mathematics.

Our students have performed significantly above the UK and international average.


Figure 2: GCSE Value Added Results in English, Mathematics and for all subjects.



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
What Do These Graphs Tell Us?

Across <u>ALL GCSE subjects</u> at SCS ALL students on average achieved **1.37 grades higher than** their potential.

In mathematics, on average ALL students achieved a remarkable 1.57 grades above their CAT4 potential grade.

In English, students achieved an incredible 1.95 grades, effectively 2 full grades, ABOVE their CAT4 potential grade.

What Does This Graph Tell Us?

SCS students have, in all subjects, significantly achieved <u>much higher</u> grades than their CAT4 potentials.





Figure 4: Actual English GCSE Grades achieved against Potential CAT4 English grades




Figure 5: Actual mathematics GCSE Grades achieved against Potential CAT4 mathematics grades
