### **Roles and Responsibilities**

#### **Job Purpose**

Malvern College Hong Kong is an authorised IB PYP and MYP school and is a candidate school for the Diploma programme. MCHK currently has 800 pupils in Prep 1 to Hundred (Years 1-11). In August 2021, we expect to be close to 1000 pupils and look forward to welcoming our first Sixth Form Cohort.

The successful candidate will contribute to the development and delivery of the College's vision and values. They will be a supportive member of the staff team to help ensure the success of Malvern College Hong Kong as a leading international school in Hong Kong.

As a Malvern College teacher the successful applicant will play a full role in the school's curricular, co-curricular and pastoral programmes.

# Main Academic Duties and Responsibilities

- Take responsibility for primary PE classes, supporting, nurturing and taking a genuine interest in the holistic development of all children in that class; the ability to take swimming classes will be an advantage;
- Work closely with the PYP Coordinator, Head of Year and PYP colleagues to ensure the
  effective delivery of the PYP programme and to design and implement a relevant,
  challenging and rigorous curriculum;
- Plan and deliver lessons, ensuring attention is given to appropriate differentiation;
- Contribute to collaborative learning at all levels of school life;
- Create inquiry-based classrooms that develop critical thinking skills, knowledge and a range of skills within an environment based on trust and respect;
- Select relevant resources and digital tools to support and enhance learning;
- Develop appropriate assessment tasks, providing timely and effective feedback that enhances pupil learning;
- Communicate effectively with pupils, parents and colleagues in a professional manner;
- Write formal reports on a termly basis;
- Provide appropriate pastoral support as and when necessary;
- Contribute to the school's House system;
- Attend Parents' Meetings, Open Mornings and CPD as appropriate;
- Play an active role in the school's co-curricular programme;
- Play a full part in the school's admissions process including attending Saturday Admissions day(s) as required; and
- Assist with any other duties, tasks or jobs as may be reasonably requested by the Headmaster.
