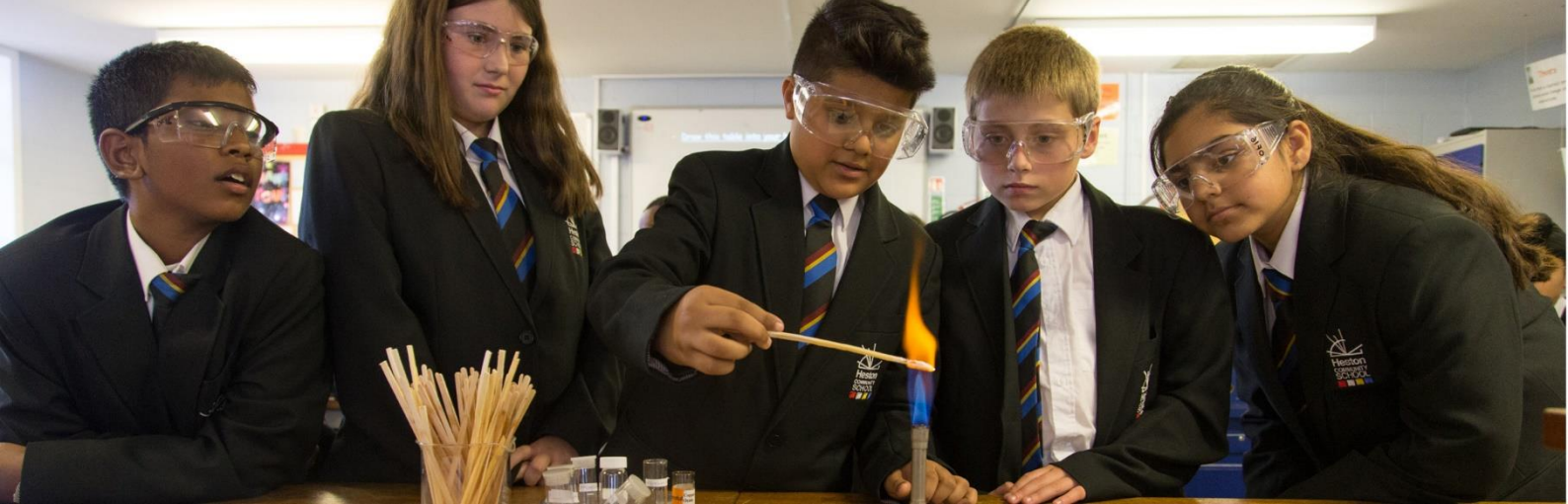

CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

Heston Community School's philosophy that every child matters is reflected in the work of the Humanities Team. Currently, at Post 16, the department offers Sociology, Psychology, History, Geography and Government and Politics. These are some of the most popular subjects at A Level which means the Social Science department is a vital component of the Sixth Form.

STAFFING

The Head of Social Science [ACL Humanities] is supported in this role by the Head of Humanities. The Social Science Team will comprise of three full-time teachers. New staff are offered an Induction Programme to facilitate their entry into the life of the School and the community and there are excellent CPD opportunities provided to Middle Leaders to develop their ability to lead and manage a Curriculum Area.

CURRICULUM ACCOMMODATION

The Social Science Team has a suite of designated teaching rooms in the Osterley Building, equipped with interactive whiteboards.



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
