Key Responsibilities:

Teaching and Learning:

- Tailors age-appropriate learning engagements and a learning environment that stimulates and empowers learners
- Differentiate learning to meet a student's individual needs, interests and passions.
- Employ an inquiry-based pedagogical approach to teaching and learning that promotes inquiry, agency and the development of creative, reflective and critical thinking skills.
- Empower students to ensure that they develop strong English language skills as well as promoting the importance and development of their home language.
- Explicitly teach approaches to learning skills.
- Provide learning experiences that build on students prior knowledge, understanding and skills.
- Support the development of international-mindedness, global citizenship, and all the attributes of the IB learner profile within the curriculum.
- Use technology as a tool to enhance teaching and learning, developing learners as skilled and knowledgeable digital citizens.
- Employ a range of teaching and learning strategies to promote independent thinking, inquiry and acquisition of subject specific knowledge and skills.
- Promote and foster student reflection as part of the learning experience.
- Foster a stimulating learning environment with high expectations based on understanding and respect.
- Empower students to develop agency and take action ethically.

Assessment:

- Develop, implement and review assessments that are effective, meaningful and provide information needed to understand where students are in their learning and what their next steps should be.
- Provide timely, effective feedback that enables students to develop their assessment capabilities, self-monitor and adjust their learning, building self-efficacy, resilience and well-being.



- Formatively and summatively assess (and document) student progress using a variety of assessment tools and strategies.
- Communicate effectively with students, parents and colleagues regarding learning and assessment i.e reports, portfolios, learning journeys, conferences and interviews etc.
- Manage and maintain student documentation in school platforms i.e. Managebac, Seesaw etc.

Collaborative Planning:

- Attend and actively contribute to weekly collaborative planning meetings.
- Work collaboratively with the pedagogical leadership team and colleagues to develop and document teaching and learning experiences using the planner and relevant curriculum documents.
- Contribute to the documentation of minutes and actions of collaborative planning meetings and work together to effectively complete agreed actions in a timely manner.

Communication:

- Demonstrate clear and open communication based on understanding and respect.
- Develop and maintain clear lines of communication with colleagues, parents and the wider school community, utilizing the schools digital tools and software effectively.
- Communicate curriculum, teaching and learning information with families via Managebac/Seesaw.
- Check school email and parent communication tools at least twice daily and use professional etiquette when communicating with all members of the school community in a timely manner.
- Respond to email within 24 hours of receipt.

Community and Culture:

- Contribute to the development of a vibrant boarding community through participation in supervision and boarding activities as required.
- Participate in professional learning, staff meetings, school and community events as required by the school.
- Participate in and share professional learning experiences that support the school's mission and vision, aligning individual and school goals to foster and support a culture of continuous improvement.
- Contribute to the wider life of the school via the house system, working parties, committees, sports teams, after school activities or other events and/or areas that help to develop a



positive school community and culture.

- Possess a positive disposition, model a growth mindset and is optimistic in the face of challenges.
- Provide support, guidance and take action to assist administration and leadership with school improvement initiatives.
- Work to foster strong, trusting and positive relationships between local and expat staff within the school, being respectful and tolerant of cultural differences.
