The Trust intends to appoint aspirational and innovative teachers and leaders who will drive standards of excellence, curriculum development and pedagogical approaches which will inspire and motivate students within the subject area. As Head of Faculty and Director of Music you will lead a team and contribute to the development of the school as a middle leader. You will plan and develop learning experiences which will foster a culture of high expectations, achievement for all and care for each individual within a dynamic learning environment where each student will be stretched, stimulated and supported to make excellent progress.

The Faculty of Performing and Creative Arts consists of Music, Art, Drama, Creative Technologies (Food and Textiles), P.E. and Dance. We very much value the contribution that the arts bring to the school and students benefit from arts throughout Key Stage 3, with GCSE options in all but dance at Key Stage 4 and Music, Drama and Art options at Key Stage 5. We run a range of co-curricular clubs to support the curriculum and music and the arts play a key role in assemblies and services.

Staff are expected to be involved in all aspects of school life and contribute to the ethos and co-curricular life of the school. We value our staff and we work collaboratively to provide professional support, C.P.D. and the sharing of good practice across both The Green School for Girls and The Green School for Boys.
