

Job Description Graduate Music Assistant

Job Purpose

- To contribute to all aspects of the musical life of the College
- To work with individual students and to encourage their development

Reporting to: Director of Music

Key Responsibilities

- To contribute to the organisation and direction of extra-curricular music throughout the College, including:
 - o directing, accompanying and participating in ensembles across a range of abilities
 - o administrative elements such as maintaining catalogues and collating registers
 - o attending and participating in concerts and events
- To co-teach some academic lessons appropriate to the GMA's interests and aptitude.
- To inspire students through musical leadership, by:
 - o providing individual aural/theory tuition
 - o arranging music for ensembles
- To share in the administration of the Music Department, including:
 - o co-ordination of instrument maintenance
 - o maintaining records of external instrumental and vocal examination results achieved by students
 - o photocopying and scanning music
 - o taking minutes at weekly Music Department meetings
 - o monitoring practice undertaken by pupils
- To work with the Director of Music and other members of the Department in encouraging the highest levels of attendance at individual lessons and ensembles
- To cover academic lessons in Music, and to undertake supervisory duties, in line with similar duties undertaken by members of the teaching staff.
- To contribute to discussions relating to the purchase of books, stationery, equipment and software for curriculum music.
- To contribute to discussions relating to the purchase of repertoire and other equipment for extra-curricular Music.
- To take responsibility for other areas as may reasonably be requested by the Headmaster or the Director of Music.
- Support the running of a boarding house.
 - $\circ\quad$ residing in the boarding house during term-time
 - o work with the Pastoral Head (the Stonyhurst term for Housemaster/Housemistress) on duties associated with boarding pastoral care
 - o to work up to a maximum of three evenings per week on boarding duty
 - o to be mindful at all times of issues relating to Safeguarding and Health & Safety
