Thank you for your interest in working with us here at SAPMAT.

Our vision for the children in our care is all about positive destinations and eliminating NEETs (young people not in education, employment or training). Now that may sound simple, but this is by no means an easy job. To attempt to change the future, one child's future at a time; to attempt to make the impossible possible; and to have unconditional positive regard alongside unbelievable resilience and a large capacity for uncertainty. These are some of the things that we manifest on a daily basis in this Trust. Working as part of this team cannot just be a job you turn up for. You can't just punch a card or clock in/clock out. It has to mean more than that. If it doesn't our students will know that and it will limit the impact that you can have with and for them.

If, however, you believe in working relentlessly to provide opportunities for some of the most atrisk, most vulnerable, most high-tariff and most disadvantaged students with opportunities they may never have had and may not yet be able to appreciate, then we and our students need you here in the Trust.

We are a rapidly expanding Alternative Provision (AP) Trust and all of our growth has been predicated on and driven by the needs of our children. Since opening in April 2018, we have developed from one AP free school on one site to a minimum of four separate AP academies across seven sites and three Local Authorities (as of September 2025). And that is just the beginning! The benefits of this growth means we can help more students, we can create more pathways for students we might not have been able to help previously, and we can retain and progress staff who believe in our vision, and have the skills and work ethic to make that vision of reality day in and day out.

Safeguarding

You will need to be eligible to work in the UK to be considered for this role.

Solihull Alternative Provision Multi Academy Trust (SAPMAT) and its member schools are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people according to child protection and safeguarding guidelines and we expect all staff and volunteers to share this commitment.

Applications which do not include a full employment history and reference details will not be taken forward to the shortlisting stage.

The post you are applying for is classed as having a high degree of contact with children and involves 'regulated activity'. As such it is exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974. It is an offence to apply for the role if you are barred from engaging in regulated activity relevant to children.

SAPMAT is a socially inclusive and equal opportunities Trust and committed to actively promoting equal opportunities for all our staff and pupils.

As part of the recruitment process, we collect and process personal data relating to job applicants. We are committed to being transparent about how we collect and use this data, in accordance with UK GDPR.
