The department, and Job Summary	<p>The Learning Enrichment department supports a range of students with additional educational requirements across Key Stages 3,4 and 5. This includes students with SEND, EAL and Higher Learning Potential.</p> <p>The Learning Support Assistant (LSA) role will be to provide learning and care support for an individual student with special educational needs (SEN) to help work towards the outcomes on their education and health care plan (EHCP). This will involve working with the teacher to plan and deliver activities and supporting the student with routines, transitions and behaviour management.</p> <p>We are lucky to teach in a beautiful listed building in central London, with excellent transport links (5 mins from Green Park & Hyde Park Tube Stations), which makes it easy for us to make Central London part of our classroom, by running local day trips across the city. Our Sixth Form building is situated in Belgravia, only moments from Victoria Station.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Organise and manage teaching space and resources to help maintain a stimulating and safe learning environment• Use ICT skills to advance the student's learning• Through observations, provide regular feedback to teachers on the student's progress, attainment and barriers to learning• Monitor, record and report on progress and attainment• Read and understand lesson plans shared prior to lessons, if available <p>Working with staff, parents/carers and relevant professionals</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Share knowledge and understanding of the student with other school staff and education, health and social care professionals, so that informed decision making can take place on intervention and provision• Communicate effectively with other staff members, students, and parents and carers• Keep other professionals accurately informed about performance, progress and any areas of concern• Understand their role in order to be able to work collaboratively with classroom teachers and other colleagues, including specialist advisory teachers• Collaborate and work with colleagues and other relevant professionals within and beyond the school• Develop effective professional relationships with colleagues <p>Professional development</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Help keep their own knowledge and understanding relevant and up to date by reflecting on their own practice, liaising with school leaders, and identifying relevant professional development to improve personal effectiveness• Take opportunities to build the appropriate skills, qualifications, and/or experience needed for the role, with support from the school• Take part in the school's appraisal procedures <p>Other areas of responsibility</p> <p>Safeguarding</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Work in line with statutory safeguarding guidance (e.g. Keeping Children Safe in Education, Prevent) and our safeguarding and child protection policies• Promote the safeguarding of all students in the school
