



On a Wednesday afternoon, we have trips, workshops and talks from top industry professionals and Universities. 





ENGLISH LANGUAGE A-LEVEL


Why is the scouse accent perceived as being friendly? How do babies learn to speak? What is a noun phrase? The study of English Language will cover all of these questions.

GEOGRAPHY A-LEVEL


Interested in climate change? Do you love landscapes? Want to know more about migration? Geography explores all of these questions and more.

PSYCHOLOGY A-LEVEL


Why do people have phobias? What is OCD? Why do we have stereotypes? The study of Psychology will answer all these questions and more.


