Welsh at Elfed High School Cymraeg yn Ysgol Uwchradd Elfed

Welsh is taught as a second language at Elfed High School, with every student learning the subject at KS3 and KS4. The number of students in the school has increased rapidly recently, making it essential for us to expand the current team of teachers.

We anticipate changes to the Welsh Government's expectations for students to achieve a Welsh Level 2 qualification and the end of the WJEC Short Course in Welsh Second Language. Increased numbers of students will study the full course, leading to the demand for an increase in the Welsh subject team and a new opportunity to lead the team as Head of Welsh.

Key Stage 3 / Cyfnod Allweddol 3

Students in Year 7 and Year 8 have two fifty minute lessons per week in mixed ability tutor groups.

In Year 9 there are two fifty minute lessons per week in two classes, set according to ability in Welsh, enabling more able students to progress at a faster rate.

Key Stage 4 / Cyfnod Allweddol 4

Welsh full course is an option in Year 10, however there has not been sufficient interest in recent years for this option to run.

All students study Welsh in Key Stage 4, some work towards the WJEC GCSE Short Course in Welsh Second Language and the remainder study for the NVQ Level 1 qualification.

The Welsh Team

Y Tîm Cymraeg

The team will be expanded with this new appointment to consist of the Head of Welsh, one full time Teacher of Welsh and one of two additional members of staff contributing small numbers of lessons as required. The line manager for the Head of Welsh is Mr C Woodman, Head of Languages. He is accountable for standards in French and Welsh and will work closely with the Head of Welsh to ensure that students achieve their potential in this subject.

We have two Welsh classrooms, both with data projectors and computer for the teacher's use.

Bilingualism

Dwyieithrwydd

We encourage students and staff to use incidental Welsh in classrooms and around the school. The Head of Welsh will provide support and encouragement for colleagues to develop their skills in the written and spoken Welsh language and to identify opportunities to put these skills to use in the everyday life of the school. There are opportunities to contribute to the Elfed Extra programme of activities through Welsh language clubs and events such as Eisteddfod Elfed.
