Opportunities

At The Radcliffe School Sixth Form you will have ample opportunities to get involved in activities, show off your skills or try out something different. We believe your time here should be enriching and fun. We have a number of opportunities which will allow you to develop new interests, abilities and make a positive contribution to the school community.

Opportunities for Leadership

We actively seek ways of providing students with opportunities to develop their leadership and organisational skills. Students are invited to take up posts as Senior Students and to act as positive role models, taking the lead in organising whole school events. This ranges from assisting in local primary schools to organising community events. We also work closely with the Milton Keynes School Sports Partnership that provides a wide range of training opportunities with national accreditations.

Partnership

The Radcliffe School Sixth Form has exciting partnerships with The Home Retail Group where students can participate in seminars, interview preparation, mentoring, work experience and take advantage of specialist facilities such as their photographic studios. We also work closely with The Open University and are involved in developing teaching and learning strategies for implementation across Europe.

Public Events

Post-16 students organise and lead whole school events including the annual Prospective Parents Evenings, School Production Front of House, Staff and Student Quiz Evenings, the Prom and the Sixth Form Yearbook. All students are encouraged to involve themselves actively in one or all of these activities.





Helping you to move on to University, Employment or Training

In addition to your studies, it is important that you make the most of developing other skills, talents and interests and gain the enjoyment and satisfaction in playing a full part in school life.

Increasingly, employers and universities are looking for students who have many skills and can balance a variety of commitments. The Volunteering and Leadership programme at The Radcliffe School includes Critical Thinking, Languages, Ethics, Sport, Creative Writing, Web Design, Young Enterprise and debating.

We know that universities value interests outside of school and evidence that you do not spend all of your time with your head in a book. In addition, they like to see some sense of community service, together with a willingness to contribute and to think of others. You will be encouraged to help others, be they in the school or wider community.

During Tutor Time students plan and prepare applications for their Post-18 pathway. Tutors and visiting experts offer support in preparing CVs and UCAS personal statements. Students are encouraged to attend Master Classes at local universities in areas of study that interest them. University Taster Days and Open Days also offer students the opportunity to find out more about further study and student life.

In Year 12, parents/carers and students are invited to our UCAS Evening to gather information about the university application process, study options and student finance. Students considering Oxbridge applications or careers in Medicine and Law will be invited to additional evening sessions to prepare for interviews and BMAT and LNAT entrance exams.

We recognise that some students will choose to use the skills and qualifications gained in the Sixth Form to find the job or training programme that is right for them. Our Careers Adviser will provide you with a personalised programme of support and advice to help you identify opportunities that meet your needs. Your Personal Tutor will help you with your applications and interview techniques.

Pastoral System

The Sixth Form pastoral system and tutor groups are organised in such a way as to enable tutors to focus specifically upon the needs of individual students. It is a student-centred approach. Therefore, a combination of group tutorials and individual personal tutoring occurs. We also provide a non-teaching Assistant Head of Sixth Form to support all students when necessary.

Role of the Personal Tutor:

- to be the primary contact point for students and have a key role in supporting active learning and personal development.
- to carry out a tutorial programme designed to promote an active independent approach to study.
- . to offer individual support to each student.
- to provide a link and referral route to the support
- to provide a link with the administration services and a communication channel between academic, pastoral, and careers support staff.
- to have responsibility for general oversight of the tutor groups.
- to monitor, guide and counsel students in academic, pastoral and welfare aspects of their development.
- · to teach an Enrichment programme.

Role of the Student:

- . to accept responsibility for their own learning.
- to be positive and active about all aspects of their academic and non-academic courses.
- · to identify their own individual needs.
- to develop core skills and effective planning and organisation.
- to set themselves realistic learning and personal targets in consultation with their tutor.
- to think through their own progress and identify areas of strengths and weaknesses and develop appropriate strategies.
- . to research their career needs.

The Radcliffe School Sixth Form entry requirements

The Radcliffe School Sixth Form is open to all students who wish to continue their studies beyond the age of 16, on the understanding that the student is prepared to study seriously and make a positive contribution to the school community. The decision on which course of study to follow should be made after carefully considering your level of achievement at the end of Year 11 and the subjects that are likely to further your career choices.

Your entry into the Sixth Form will be based on the following:

- Examination results
- · Interview with Senior staff at The Radcliffe School

Key Steps

By the end of March: Deadline for submitting your application form.

Throughout March/April: Interviews for external applicants

Careers

A Careers Adviser is available on site to all Post-16 students. They provide personalised guidance and access to support on a range of issues which might affect you. This may include careers, education and financial advice and guidance.

You can request an individual interview so that support can be personalised to meet your individual needs. The Adviser is an expert in helping make difficult decisions more manageable.

We recognise that you may be studying, or have studied, other types of qualifications in addition to GCSEs. We consider a variety of qualifications as equivalents to GCSEs. Each of our courses list specific entry requirements and these will be discussed with you at interview. Whatever your qualifications, please do not hesitate to contact us to discuss your options.
