LEARNING SUPPORT AT CATERHAM

The Learning Support Department aims to ensure that all pupils have full access to the curriculum and are enabled to achieve their potential regardless of their level of need or difficulty. Individual needs are carefully assessed and monitored by working in close partnership with pupils, parents, teachers and, where appropriate, outside agencies and specialists.

The Learning Support Department is a highly valued and well-respected department within the school, liaising closely with teaching and pastoral staff to ensure that pupils with SEND are supported across the curriculum. You would be joining a supportive and collaborative team, committed to professional growth and development. You would be a key part of our team, helping to shape the school's vision for inclusivity and ensuring that all pupils, regardless of need, have the opportunity to thrive.

Any Caterham pupil with a specific learning difficulty or other neurodiversity has full access to the curriculum and is included in a fully integrated teaching programme. Informal screening is carried out from time to time and this, together with feedback from subject teachers and discussions with a pupil's Head of Year, could lead us to suggest a short period of targeted support from one of the Learning Support teachers or an assessment with an external specialist recommended by the School.

THE ROLE

To support the SENCO in all aspects of the management of the Senior School Learning Support Department and the effective delivery of its aim to ensure that students with additional learning needs can reach their academic potential.

To support the SENCO in ensuring that pupils with any Learning Support needs are identified and supported through effective guidance to teaching colleagues and appropriate adjustments in class and exams, whilst ensuring effective and supportive partnerships with parents.

Responsibilities (teaching)

Specialist teaching and pupil support (Years 7-13), generally one to one, but may be grouped, especially for revision and exam skills

Preparing individually tailored lesson plans for each pupil and organising or creating teaching resources as appropriate

Target-setting and evaluation of lessons with follow-up plan and communicating with teaching staff and parents where appropriate

Responding to and following up on referrals from teachers, parents and pupils

In-class observation of pupils, with follow-up recommendations

Responsibilities (general)

Carrying out individual and group screening and assessments

Regular liaison with teaching staff to monitor pupil progress and provide specialist advice

Preparing and updating individual pupil support plans and liaising with teaching staff on specific pupil requirements

Reading specialist reports and implementing appropriate support and any exam access arrangements as appropriate

Completion and collation of necessary documents and evidence for access arrangements

Regular liaison with parents by way of email, phone calls or face-to-face meetings

Half-termly meeting with Heads of Year to review pupil referrals and support

Analysis of pupil data both to consider whether further screening or intervention may be appropriate, and to review the effect of existing intervention

Experience of working with high achieving, academically able pupils
