Some 40 boys are currently actively involved in the multisport with an impressive number of pupils progressing to represent at national level.

Whitgift PE department is seeking to appoint an enthusiastic and experienced coach to join the department. The successful candidate must have a sporting background and experience in coaching and working with children. The position is available from September 2023.

OUTLINE OF POST:

We are seeking a highly skilled and motivated multi-discipline and endurance coach to join our dynamic sports department. In this role, you will play a crucial role in enhancing our multi-discipline sporting opportunities. Your primary focus will be on running and swimming, while also providing support and coaching for the Modern Pentathlon programme. Additionally, you will assist in various areas of the Physical Education (PE) and games delivery.

MAIN DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Responsible for designing and delivering training sessions for the Running and Swimming training.
- Supporting the Head of Modern Pentathlon with various administration tasks
- Active involvement in talent identification and recruitment of athletes
- Coaching and supporting pupils at all competitions
- Commitment to the significant co-curricular programme that operates at the school, as well as a significant number of weekends

- Drive and energy to promote and enhance the existing multi-disciplinary provision
- Commitment is required to the significant co-curricular programme that operates at the School during the week and over a significant number of weekends.

CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

This position is offered as a permanent, full-time, full-year contract commencing from September 2023.

The Multi-Discipline and Endurance Coach will work 5 days per week. The hours are 8.00am to 5.00pm (40 hours per week) with a one-hour unpaid lunch break. There will be a requirement for flexibility with start and finishing times to meet the needs of the department or for school events throughout the year that may fall on weekends or during school holiday periods. Any changes will be mutually agreed in advance with your line manager.
