- contribute to constructive team-building amongst teaching and non-teaching staff, parents and governors;
- collaborate with support staff as appropriate.

The teacher will:

- know their students and how they learn;
- display a deep understanding of subject content and how to teach it;
- plan appropriately to meet the needs of all pupils, through differentiation of tasks;
- assess, provide feedback and report on student learning;
- be able to set clear targets, based on prior attainment, for pupils' learning;
- keep appropriate and efficient records, integrating formative and summative assessment into





weekly and termly planning;

- report to parents on the development, progress and attainment of pupils;
- provide a stimulating learning environment, where resources can be accessed appropriately by all pupils;
- create and maintain supportive and safe learning environments;
- establish effective routines in class to support student learning
- display a wide variety of teaching strategies to proactively engage students in their learning, addressing any behavior issues promptly, fairly and respectfully, and in accordance with the school's behaviour policy;
- participate in meetings and collaborative staff teams as requested;
- lead, organise and collaborate with support staff within the classroom;
- actively engage in professional learning;
- participate in the performance management system for the appraisal of their own performance and development, or that of other teachers;
- engage professionally with colleagues, parents and member of the broader school community.
