Dear Parent/Carer

Thank you as always for another fantastic week - your support really makes such a difference. On Wednesday Mr. Stapleton and myself spent the day walking around the school and we were so impressed by the high standards of learning and behaviour we saw. Every day together we move this school forward a little more – to the point where we this week we became 'operationally full' in some year groups meaning that we have had to start waiting lists for the first time in years. Your daily work with your children and the interactions with our staff have so much impact. Thank you.

Firstly a few dates for your diary: -

- <u>Wednesday 5th December</u> Year 10 Parents Evening from 4pm to 6.30pm in the Activities Hall. Booking is now live for on-line appointments. If you need any help with these please do not hesitate to see the ladies in Reception. As always, we are looking for a 100% attendance unless there are significantly extenuating circumstances. Your support here is so important at this vital time in their education.
- Friday 7th December: Inset Day school will be closed all day to students.
- <u>Tuesday 18th December</u>: As notified last week we will incorporate Christmas Lunch and Christmas Jumper Day on this day. Letters will be sent home early December with all the details for you.
- <u>Wednesday 19th December</u>: As a reminder school will close at 1.35pm on Wednesday 19th December. Those children who are taken home by mini bus will be taken at 1.35pm unless parents/carers notify us otherwise.
- Wednesday 3rd January 2019: School re-opens after the Christmas break. Whole school returns on this day there will be no training day.

Yesterday our Shoe Boxes were collected, and we are delighted to be involved again in such a worthwhile cause. We managed to send off 121 boxes this morning which will going to children in the remote villages in Moldova, Eastern Europe. I am sure that our small gifts of generosity will go a long way in these resource-stricken communities. Something which may seem so small can make such a difference to a child's life. We have this week been holding PPE exams for both year 11 and Sixth Form, this is a great opportunity for students and staff alike to familiarise themselves with our exam procedures. There are two days left of mock exams, next Monday 26th and Tuesday 27th November. We are delighted with the way our pupils have conducted themselves who are a credit to both the school and yourselves. There is a real energy around this year group at this moment as they continue to prepare for the summer examinations.

If your child/children cycle to school, please can you remind them of how to cycle safely to and from school and not to put themselves in any danger. We have had to speak to a few of our children who have been cycling in a way as to not only put themselves at risk but pedestrians too. Your co-operation with this would be greatly appreciated to ensure the safety of our children, which is paramount. I would remind you that lights on bikes are essential and I would recommend they wear helmets as well.

Next week when the PPEs finish the PE Department will be opening up the Sports Hall for students to play Basketball – as the weather gets colder we are keen to provide more activities in the warm for the students. We are listening to the students and trying to fulfil their requests!

This really has been a great week; we are seeing an increase in attendance (happy children come to school!); behaviour points have dropped and moved from predominantly about disruption to learning behaviours; children are happy around the school; and the Year 11s seem so happy about their PPEs. We are really moving in the right direction!

ATTENDANCE EXPECTATIONS

Outstanding attendance at BCS gives your child the very best chance of success. We place a high value on attending school regularly at TBCS due to the impact that absence has on learning.

Research shows how much education can be lost by having just a handful of days absent each year.

We track all students' attendance and intervention is given when a student drops below 95%, our school target. Some students last year dropped below our minimum expectation of 90% and are being tracked more closely with intervention being put in place.

We do understand that all students get ill from time to time, but as that you think very carefully before allowing your child to stay at home in the event of illness. In the case of sickness, please not that we do not follow the 48 hour policy.

Year 7 Art Homework - This fortnight - 26/11/2018 to 07/12/2018


Students are required to find FIVE artworks by the artist Giorgio Morandi and print them out for their next art lesson.


GEOGRAPHY

Gospel Reflection

Feast of Christ the Universal King

It is you who say that I am a king John 18:33-37

Pilate said to Jesus, "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus answered, "Do you say this on your ownor have others told you about me?" Pilate answered, "I am not a Jew, am I?" Your own nation and the chief priests handed you over to me. What have you done?" Jesus answered, "My kingdom does not belong to this world." If my kingdom did belong to this world, my attendants would be fighting to keep me from being handed over to the Jews. But as it is, my kingdom is not here." So Pilate said to him, "Then you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say I am a king. For this I was born and for this I came into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice."

Monday

Christ the King Sunday celebrates the role of Jesus as ruler over all of the universe. However, it's important to recall that despite this, Jesus is king because he is a humble servant. Jesus' kingship is not one of power and riches, but of love and humility, as demonstrated by his life on earth. Jesus shows us that you do not have to be rich or powerful to be important. He teaches us that what is more important is how you treat others. In this gospel, Pilate is confused. He couldn't understand what Jesus was saying to him. Pilate asks Jesus if he is the king of the Jews. Jesus answers that his **kingdom is not of this world.** So he asks Jesus again if he is a king. Jesus replies that he was born to come into the world and share the truth with all people. His Kingdom does not have boundaries, but is found of the hearts of all who sincerely try to live out the Truth of God's Love.

Write how you think that truth can make people happy. Tell your neighbour.


Wednesday
