Thank you for your interest in the above post, which is required from September 2019 and which offers an excellent opportunity for you to be part of a forward looking and successful team.

English is a very popular subject throughout the school and is at the forefront of curriculum changes within the Academy. Examination results are good, with 85% achieving 9-4 in 2018 and 27% achieving 9-7. We have seen a consistent trend of increasing results, despite the changing national picture. Students make good progress in English, above the National Average for both expected and more than expected progress. The Faculty makes a significant contribution to the life of the Academy, supporting colleagues throughout the Academy to incorporate reading, writing and communication skills into their lessons and continue to drive standards forward. Candidates are therefore sought who are capable, enthusiastic and willing to be an active team member contributing to the life and achievements of the Faculty.

The English Faculty at Hummersknott aims to provide a broad experience for all students and is currently comprised of 11 specialists with additional input from members of the school's Learning Support Department. Within the Faculty we also have a team of staff who teach Media Studies, which is taught to Key Stage 4 and is a popular option subject.

Colleagues work to foster a delight in uses of language both spoken and written, whether it be in discussion, debate, film, television, drama, literature or students' own writing. We aim to stimulate aesthetic and critical awareness, to provoke thought and the capacity to express viewpoint with confidence. We strive to fully equip our students for life in the 21st Century and ensure the use of ICT in all its forms is present within our curriculum.

Throughout both Key Stages, students are encouraged to take a full part in their own learning: to think for themselves, accept responsibility and to evaluate constructively their own progress. At Key Stage 3 we have developed a personalised programme for each group to ensure that all students have the opportunity to make outstanding progress with schemes of work which are specifically targeted to students' needs and designed, from Year 7 to support the acquisition of skills for the 9-1 GCSE specification. We teach the AQA specifications at GCSE, with all students taking English Language and English Literature.
